She will emphasize the use of tracing paper and stencils as an aid to composition. There will be both experimental and traditional approaches, with critique and demonstrations daily. Topics will include wet-into-wet, underpainting and layering, designing with shapes, and foolproof methods for clean washes. Although the class is not geared to beginners, all levels are welcome. Barbara Nechis is an artist who has developed a style known for its masterful balance of spontaneity and control of the watercolor brush. She was a faculty member of Parsons School of Design for many years and gave seminars at Pratt Institute. Nechis has taught throughout North America, Europe, and Asia. In addition, she has served as a juror and director of AWS.

Nechis is the author of Watercolor From the Heart (Watson-Guptill,

1993) and *Watercolor the Creative Experience* (North Light Books, 1979). Her work appears in many publications, such as *American Artist Magazine*, *Watercolor 20th anniversary issue (20 Great Teachers)*, Fall 2006, and *Watercolor Magic (Taking your Art to the Next Level)*.
