Celebrate St. Patrick's Day, March 17th, with CWA and CHARLES REID!

Reid will be our Guest Artist for the CWA General Meeting

Charles Reid's painting buddy, Tony Bennett, says: "There is only one way to describe Charles Reid's artistry: one picture's worth a thousand words. Take one look at his brilliant watercolors and vou realize nobody does it better."

Back by popular demand, making his 3rd appearance to CWA in 8 years, is artist extraordinaire Charles Reid. Charles' fans are legendary – this workshop sold out very early – and they often travel around the country to attend his workshops (including our own Leslie Wilson). The last time that Charles was here for a general meeting, he gave a presentation of his work, but this time we've persuaded him to do a demonstration. So here is an opportunity to see Reid at work and learn about his unique approach to watercolor, and his creative processes!

CWA's second workshop of the year with Charles Reid includes a three days of painting live models and two days of working from historic photographs. Reid will demonstrate his drawing techniques that help him to render an accurate portrait of the models.

Charles will show us how he achieves the freshness in his watercolors for which he is rightly famous.



Charles Reid was the featured artist in the August 2009 Watercolor Artist. He has long been considered a master of the medium of watercolor, and has written eleven books on painting in watercolor and in oil. His paintings are fresh and spontaneous, displaying his profound understanding of light and color and expert drawing ability. The viewer is immediately drawn into his rich compositions. His figures are beautifully rendered, in a simple, direct and natural, gestural manner that reveals his interest in painting the light as much as the person.

In addition to his books, Charles has made instructional videos and DVDs, including "Charles Reid, Painter: The Figure in Watercolor," inspired by his classic book, "Figure Painting in Watercolor," and his most recent DVD, "Charles Reid's 10-Lesson Course" (a 4-hour, 3-DVD set, highly recommended by Leslie Wilson). Charles has long been appreciated for his instructional techniques – as another artist once said of him: "I recall Reid causing quite a sensation among my fellow students at the art college when his watercolor painting books were first published. I have always admired Reid's contemporary impressionistic paintings, which are often both spontaneous and whimsical in their feeling, yet based on fine and solid draftsmanship."

Reid was born in Cambridge, New York, and studied art at the University of Vermont at Montpelier and the Art Students League of New York. He has won numerous awards, including the Childe Hassam Purchase Prize at the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and from the National Academy of Design and the American Watercolor Society. In 1980 he was elected an Associate of the National Academy of Design. Public collections of his work include Smith College, Yellowstone Art Center, Brigham Young College, Roche Corporation, and the National Academy of Design.

CWA water media definition

CWA's policy is that for exhibition purposes we accept watermedia on paper and paperboard, matted and framed under plexiglass. We also accept watercolor on watercolor canvas with a protective glaze and sealed, and watercolor on Yupo.

Watermedia includes:

Transparent watercolor

Opaque watercolors: gouache

Watercolor pencils

Watercolor crayons

Inks

Dyes

Tempera

Acrylics (on paper/paper board, not on canvas)

Juanita Hagberg visited Kim Hwang's 5th grade classroom at Delaine Eastin Elementary School in Union City. The students were introduced to brush characteristics, spatter and sponge techniques, washes and line. The students then learned about and painted imagined landscapes. Their next task was to remove a shoe to do a contour drawing and a painting of their footwear. Some interesting and creative paintings emerged!

CWA Outreach in February went from elementary school to high school. On

February 5th Jack Gautreaux was the guest artist at the Palomares Art Festival at Palomares Elementary in Castro Valley. He taught 28 fifth graders to paint a simple landscape using different techniques, spontaneity and control of their brushes. The children were attentive, enthusiastic to learn and proud of their results. Their teacher asked us to come back next year. Jack was assisted by Michal Weinstein, Assistant Outreach Director.

On February 12th Charlotte Huntley taught an art class at Concord High School for thirty-four 10th, 11th and 12th graders. The room was crowded but the students didn't seem to mind. Charlotte taught the children different techniques, including how to paint a wash, how to color wet-into-wet and how to mix black using only the primary colors. Charlotte's visit was the inauguration of this classes' watercolor unit which goes on for about 4 - 6 weeks with progressively more complex assignments. Charlotte was assisted by Michal Weinstein, Assistant Outreach Director, Warren Dean, the art instructor and Neal Huntley, Charoltte's ever helpful husband.

from the budget director

CWA Financial Report

From a financial viewpoint, CWA has a lot going on. We get income from membership dues, workshops, show entry fees, artist sales commissions, donations, and many other sources. Our expenses include the costs to put on workshops, shows, and school programs, as well as our member services - newsletter, roster, monthly programs. In addition we have the usual expenses of running a non-profit organization - insurance, taxes, bookkeeping, etc. This article provides the annual reporting of the past year summary of all this, and the budget for the current year.

CWA ended up the year 2009 with a small deficit. The total income was \$108,200 and

the total expenses were \$112,400. This was primarily due to the cash flow timing of the 2009 National Exhibition - much of the income was received in 2008 and all of the expenses were in 2009. We feel that this will turn around in 2010.

The pie charts show the breakdown of the budget for 2010. The total income is projected to be \$128,300, and the total expenses to be \$127,600. This budget, adopted by the CWA Board of Directors, shows a slight surplus which will provide some reserve for the year. Some particular items to note:


• Workshops and the National Exhibition are both large income sources and large


expenses, but both are projected to show a profit.

- We are projecting an increase in membership dues in 2010. Please encourage your fellow artists to join so we can make sure this happens.
- The CWA Newsletter continues to be a major expense, primarily for printing and mailing the hard copies. Switching to receiving the newsletter by email will help CWA's finances and you also get to see it in color!

"Acoma Pueblo"

I came to painting very late. I actually came to making art late. In the small, rural southern Indiana town in which I grew up, there was very little art in the schools until

high school, where in order to graduate, one needed a semester of art. In that semester I was exposed to a variety of things, but what grabbed me was wood carving. I always intended to do more, but college and life intervened.

In 1991 I began stone carving at Santa Monica College and fell in love with it. It took a while, but I got to that point of co-creating sculptures with the stone—a real "in flow" experience. The tendons in my wrists began to complain, so I left each carving session on Saturday morning and went straight to the acupuncturist. (continued on page 8)

After I moved to the Bay Area in 2000, however, my wrists finally became so painful I had to stop. This was not only a huge loss, but a worry. Retirement was only a few years away and I knew I had to find something artistic I could do.

I decided to try painting (surely holding a brush would not hurt) and found Pablo Villacana-Lara teaching watercolor at Piedmont High School. What a fortunate find—a gentle, very caring person who taught basic techniques and gave enormous support. Pablo also encouraged his students to engage with CWA. I'll never forget one of my first meetings when Jane Hofstetter was the presenter. I watched her take an action, see what the paint and water and paper wanted to do in response, and based on that, take another action. I got goose bumps—it would be possible to get to that state, which I had so loved with the stones, with painting.

Since then, I have overcome my phobia of drawing, thanks to Mira White; observed and experimented with Myrna Wacknov; learned color theory and mixing from Dorcas Moulton; and painted with the East Bay Plein Air group which has graciously supported my awkward attempts to address the great outdoors.

I have added writing, including poetry, to my creative pursuits. I have in mind a book with my nature paintings providing the inspiration for poems or stories that help people make a better connection with our earth—to "see" that human and nature are one, sharing great potential for beauty. In this I see one of the threads of my life: years in the mental health field, followed by years as an Organization Development Consultant in the health arena, and now a vision of art as healing. A satisfying continuity.
