

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September Guest Artist Skip Lawrence

Our guest artist for both our September General Meeting and our September Workshop is Skip Lawrence, an internationally recognized

and respected artist, teacher, and author. He has been featured in major art publications and holds numerous awards for his artistic achievements. Together with his friend and colleague Christopher Schink, Lawrence is one of the co-editors of The Palette Magazine. He is also one of the instructors for the Intensive Studies Seminar held annually in Taos, together with Alex Powers and Christopher Schink, who have recently given workshops for CWA, and Katherine Chang Liu, who will be here next year.

The Palette Magazine is the product of over 11 years of collaboration between Skip Lawrence and Christopher Schink. Together they share their knowledge of painting with artists of all backgrounds, for artists, by artists, as they say.

But Lawrence's real passion teaching, and he has taught in high schools, colleges, church basements, and even hotel auditoriums. His goal is to help artists move beyond technique and to find their own "purpose." He draws an analogy to that of the aspiring young author who spends years perfecting his grammar, spelling, and punctua-



tion, but forgets to tell a story - sometimes artists need reminding that it is the story that they are trying to tell that is most important.

"As a teacher I encourage students to share their own personal stories and beliefs through their art. I feel that most forms of art education today put too much emphasis on technique over content. That's not to say that technique and design are not important elements to a successful painting in fact they are necessary. 'You can't write a great novel with a five word vocabulary,' and the same is true of painting."



As Lawrence has found over the years, however, what many new and old artists alike are lacking is purpose, the reason why they paint. "I have found that the most extraordinary paintings - the ones that really grab my attention - are those that tell a story unique to the artist who created them."

As he describes his teaching style – helping us to find our inner purpose - he says he teaches this way for a simple reason: the thrill of making something beautiful does not come from perfect technique and design, but from making something that is an honest sharing of experiences, ideas, or observations from one person to another.

Come enjoy an evening of inspiration with Skip Lawrence and CWA. See you in September!


CWA Partners with Ombudsman Services of CCCo

Eligibility: Open to all artists, ages 18 and over. Theme of "Reading" for all entries. Entries must depict

reading or writing as subject matter to be eligible. Entries may not be smaller than 18" or larger than 48 x 50" framed. Original, recent (within 2 years) water media on paper, Yupo accepted. No copies or class work. Paintings must be framed in metal or wood, covered with Plexiglas, (no glass) wired and ready to hang. No saw tooth, clamps or screw eyes. Flat brackets required on wood frames. No cardboard or masking tape. No wide (over 3 inches) or Rococo frames. White or off-white mats only. Diablo Valley College has determined unsuitable for hanging any nudes or any subject which

can be construed as being religious or political in nature.

Entry Procedures: Limited to 2 entries per artist. Fees \$10.00 entry fee for each painting, two submissions total,

CWA members. Use JPEG files only. Minimum size is 1200x1800 pixels (4"x 6"). 300 dpi is required. Images that do not meet these requirements will be rejected. Crop images to exclude frames or mats. An entry is one individual art work. All jpgs on 1 CD. CD must be labeled with artist name. CDs will not be returned. Each image/jpg must have: An image number (1-2), title, (as it corresponds to the entry form) and first initial & last name. Artist to provide self-addressed

stamped business size envelope for notification of acceptance letter.

Labels: Print labels – from the CWA website www.californiawatercolor.org, click forms on the drop down

menu. The top third goes on upper left corner on back of work. The remaining 2 are sent with entry

fee and jpg.

Insurance: Your paintings will be handled with the best of care; however, CWA and its volunteers assume no

responsibility for the loss or damage of any kind. Insurance is the sole responsibility of the artist.

Sales: All sales will be through the artist. There will be no early removals during the show. The artist

is responsible to CWA for 25% of sales. (15% of sales to Outreach and 10% goes to the building

fund).

Member selection is based on the quality of work and the needs of the gallery. All artists showing at the gallery on an on-going basis must be members of CWA with dues current. Artists will be accepted as vacancies

occur.

SELECTION JURORS: 2-3 past CWA Presidents and the Gallery Directors of Gallery Concord

ARTIST DUTIES: Member artists must make a six month commitment to Gallery Concord.

Member artists will be required to sit approximately one day a month. Member artists must also volunteer for duties once a quarter at receiving, hanging, or the reception. Artists wishing to no longer be a member of the

gallery must give 30 days notice prior to the end of a quarter.

GALLERY ENTRIES: To allow equal representation, a point system, based on the painting sizes, is

used to determine the number of entries per member artist for each show. No copies or class work allowed. Paintings must be completely framed in metal or wood, wired and ready to hang. No sawtooths, clamps or screw eyes. Flat brackets required on wood frames. Plexiglas is required on all paintings larger than 14" in any direction. Member artists may show only water based media on paper. Gallery Concord reserves the right to withhold the hanging of any painting. Framed artwork may be hung in the Gallery only

once a year. Unframed pieces may be shown more than once in a year.

SHOWS: Member artist shows are changed quarterly.

FEES: Fees of \$25 per quarter are paid by member artists by cash or check made

payable to Gallery Concord.

HOURS: The gallery is open Thursday through Sunday 11:00 to 4:00.

RECEPTIONS: A reception is held with the opening of each new show. Artists are expected

to attend the receptions.

SALES: 15% of sales will go to CWA Scholarship/Outreach Program.

OTHER EVENTS: The Gallery classroom can be used by gallery member artists for

workshops, classes, and other events. Permission must be secured from a gallery director. There are no charges for the use of the

gallery.
