May Guest Artist Jeannie McGuire



Jeannie McGuire paints portraits and figures, but with a rich personal style that has won her many awards. "My passion is creat-

ing 'figurative works' -strong watercolor paintings of people that illuminate their personalities, explore their character and play with persona." Mood, not an exact likeness or detailed setting for her figures, is what characterizes Jeannie's paintings, along with an approach to watercolor painting that utilizes large brushes and a higher pigment to water ratio, layering and a flexible approach to color. With her background in photography and graphic design, Jeannie has been able to express her passion in paintings that have garnered numerous awards. She exhibits in regional and international shows, teaches workshops, gives demos, and juries shows and is affiliated with the Pittsburgh Watercolor Society, Associated Artists of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh Under Water and various small groups of collaborative artists. Jeannie's work was featured in the August 2011 issue of "Watercolor Artist" magazine, and her painting "Kenneth" was awarded the American Watercolor Society's Gold Medal of Honor in the 144th international show in New York.

On her website, Jeannie states, "My creative paintings are impressionistic original pieces of art with identifiable subjects versus a traditional portrait. For those that prefer a more realistic look, my style lends a fresh feeling to portraits and full figures." Jeannie works from photographs she has taken herself, acquired snapshots, client family photos and some life drawing. "I've always sought to create a persona, a mood, a feeling, so that when viewers look at my art, they're not just seeing a replica of a photograph. I want to create some kind of a story, or just some kind of emotion or

feeling, almost as if you're privy to a snippet of time in somebody's life."

Jeannie's approach to watercolor painting evolved out of a determination to find a different way of working; one summer she challenged herself by painting the same reference photo repeatedly, exploring ways to make something different. This was the beginning of an approach to painting that focuses on body language, tonal cadences, and the texture and movement of the paint itself to express the mood. Jeannie sees things in graphic form; her backgrounds tend to be minimalist and she frequently crops her compositions which tends to bring the viewer more intimately into contact with the content.

The full title of Jeannie's workshop is: Figurative Design Workshops: Depicting figures and faces using watercolor in a non-traditional way. She encourages and challenges participants to communicate a story or feeling in their paintings and create strong figurative works of art in watercolor. Referencing a variety of photographs and snap shots, the focus is to absorb the viewer by developing emotion and movement; intertwining figurative subjects with their background; seeing natural design in reference materials; exploring the impact of cropping and the placement of contrast; and most importantly a purpose for creating art. Through demonstrations, candid conversation and individual time, Jeannie shares her painting style and thoughts as well as the versatility of watercolor when employing a higher ratio of pigment to water.

Given Jeannie's very unique approach to watercolor portraiture, the demonstration at the meeting should be extremely interesting and informative, and we look forward to it.



It's always nice to make a new friend, and if you are in the area, stop by at 128 Greenfield Ave. His door has the big wooden palette handle on the outside and the long paintbrush on the inside, complete with bristles! Black Cat Studio agreed to return as a Patron, rounding out a wonderful April afternoon!

Entries will be closed by the time you read this, but as I write, we're receiving a steady stream of exceptional images. With just a week to go, we're well on our way to another wonderful exhibition. Looking back in the archives, I see that "history indicates we receive the majority of entries in the last week..." History repeats itself!

Our juror, Katherine Chang Lui, will make her selections, and we will send email notices to all entrants by June 6, 2011.
