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

from the president

A new board member, Susan Lenoir, will soon move out of the area She told me she was sorry she hadn't gotten active in CWA earlier, and said "I've realized that by volunteering in something like CWA I get to volunteer, feed my artistic side and spend time with kindred spirits." We've had a busy year in CWA and are now winding down our activities in preparation for the holidays.

- Our Outreach program was active in local classrooms, at our national exhibition in Ross, and held a successful teachers' workshop at Gallery Concord.
- Our Workshops committee hosted its first workshop in February and just finished its 7th in October. The instructors also graced our general meetings with fine demos.
- Our National Exhibition, held in the Marin Art and Garden Center in Ross, is now over, and the paintings have been shipped back to their creators.

One of the new innovations this year was the use of all-digital submissions to our National Exhibition. Anne Jacobson, Eileen Libby and I put together am on-line system that handled registration, submission of digital images, payment of entry fees, and communication back to the artists. We eliminated the making of slides or CDs. Nothing had to be mailed to CWA, or returned to the artists in SASE. All communications were done with email. The digital images make it easier for our committee to organize and verify them and to pass them on to our juror.

Inspired by this success, Anne next asked your board to consider combining the large membership database that she nurtures with our website, which Samantha McNally and I try to keep up-to-date. With the board's approval, Anne located a website developer with experience in building sites for many organizations, including the San Diego Watercolor Society. Our plan is to have this new system ready for the 2012 membership renewal cycle. You can read more about this system in Anne's report on page 6.

I've found it useful over the years to keep a few maxims in mind. I'm sure you're familiar with them: "Don't sweat the small stuff." "Give people a chance to contribute." "Why not do it now?" "When you don't care who gets the credit, it's amazing what you can accomplish." "Live one day at a time." "Be thankful for each new day."

This last one appears at the top of my "life calendar". When my father died ten years ago at age 93, I started a personal calendar to represent the next 30 years. It is a piece of graph paper (remember that?) with 1 millimeter squares. Each one corresponds to a day in my life. Each horizontal line of 90 squares corresponds to three months. As I cross the days off, and see the strip of pencil marks slowly creep down the page, I am reminded of the passage of time and the need to not waste those precious days. About a third of the page is already full. But, if I've miscalculated, and need more space, I have a spare sheet tucked away.

My days spent as your president were not wasted. They were challenging, educational, and fun because I got a chance to work with you and to meet many more of you, our amazing CWA members. Thanks for the chance to serve you.

Board-Approved Changes in Bylaws for January 2012 Meeting

The Board has approved several changes to the bylaws, which are shown in **bold print and underlined**. The Board requests approval by the Membership at the January 2012 General Meeting.

The changes are mostly adding clarifications and additional information on board member responsibilities, but there are some more significant items, which are:

- 1. Change in the membership term period to allow memberships of 1-3 years in length, not just the current 1-year membership.
- 2. Change in the date of membership from January 1-December 31 to a period based on the joining or renewing date. For example, a member who renews on January 10, 2012 will have a membership until January 9, 2013 (or 2014/2015 if multi-year option chosen).
- 3. The proration of membership dues for new members will no longer apply, since the membership period will be for 12 months from joining date.
- 4. The addition of 2 new positions to the Board, as Members At-Large.
- 5. A quorum is now defined as a majority of Board members, as opposed to a fixed number.

ARTICLE II. MEMBERSHIP

Section 5. Dues. All members, unless otherwise stated in these Bylaws, shall pay **annual** dues as determined by the Board. **Dues** are payable **when joining CWA. Members may pay dues for 1 - 3 years.**

All Board <u>members</u> shall be exempt from payment of <u>one year's</u> dues for each full year <u>of service</u>.

Section 8. Resignation and Reinstatement.

.... A member can only be reinstated after payment of dues.

ARTICLE III. BOARD

Section 2.

.....Director(s) of Communications, Director(s) of Workshops Two (2) Members At-Large

ARTICLE IV. DUTIES AND RESPONSI-BILITIES OF BOARD MEMBERS

Section 2. Vice President.

..... The Vice President shall act as board liaison to the National Exhibition Committee.

Section 3. Director(s) of Shows.

..... The Director(s) of Shows shall act as board liaison to the show chairs.

Section 4. Director(s) of Programs. The Director(s) of Programs shall be in charge of programs for the general meetings, and shall act as Board liaison to the video librarian(s), hospitality chair and technical support.

Section 5. The Budget Director. The Budget Director shall be accountable to the Board for all funds of the Association; shall act as a custodian of the Association's investment accounts, and shall manage the balances of all CWA financial accounts as approved by the Board; shall review bill-paying and record-keeping activity, and shall oversee accounts along with the bookkeeper. The Budget Director shall maintain an inventory of all property of every kind and nature of the Association and maintain proper records. In the first quarter of the year, the Budget Director shall provide to the newsletter for publication the annual financial report and approved budget proposal. The Budget Director shall act as Board liaison to the bookkeeper and tax preparer.

Section 6. Membership Director.

..... The Membership Director shall act as Board liaison to the data manager and the greeter at general meetings.

Section 9. Director(s) of Workshops.

..... The Director(s) of Workshops shall act as Board liaison to the Workshop Committee.

Section 10. Outreach Director.

..... The Outreach Director is the liaison for the Outreach Coordinator.

Section 11. Members At-Large. The two members at-large will have no assigned programs. They will provide assistance to the Board on special assignments, will learn the Board's functions, and will serve as liaison between the Board and the general membership.

ARTICLE VIII. QUORUM

Section 2. A quorum of the Board shall consist of a majority of members.

It's Time to Renew Your Membership the CWA New Website & Online Registration System is Here

The new website is up and running, has a lot more content, and is easier to use than our old one. And it is also **beautiful**, thanks to the talented Gloderworks design team. You'll see slide shows of award winners in our recent National Exhibitions and shows, images from General Meetings and Paint-outs posted on our CWA Facebook page. We have added more drop-down menus for easier system navigation, and one-click access to a lot of content such as our calendar, workshops, and the like. **Members Login** and **Join/Renew** buttons are in the upper right corner for easy access to the system. And once you are logged in, the Members Login button changes to Logout, so you will always know your status on the system.

Some of this extra content is for members only, such as the online **Members Directory**, so to fully use the system, you will need to log in. In addition to the extra content, having a **Members Only** area provides protection for our members' information.

In the **Members Only** area you will find links to update your personal details, volunteer activities, login ID, password, sign up for **member shows, sign up for paint-outs, and sign up for work-shops at the discounted member rate.** (While you can sign up for workshops without logging in, you would be charged the non-member price.)

Membership Renewal does require you to log in, not surprisingly, and shortly you will be receiving instructions by email on how to log in and use the renewal site. For those of you who used our previous online registration system – more than half of our membership - it will look much the same, but better. It is now a key component of our new Content Management System (CMS), which combines our website and database into a fully integrated system.

All members with current emails will receive a system notice giving you unique Log-in ID and password for your first time accessing the system, which you can then change once you log in. This unique Log-in ID will be a combination of your First Name and Your CWA System ID Number, in most cases a 4 digit number, so for example, my log-in ID might be Anne1234.

To log in, go to our home page, www.californiawatercolor.org. There you will see a button in the upper right that says Member Log-in. Click here and put in the Log-in ID and password that we sent. If your membership is current, you will be directed to the Member's Home page. On the right side will be a list of links to various parts of the Members' Only section.

• As you renew your membership, please review and correct your information by choosing the My Details (name, address, phone, email, and website, if you have given them to us). Your information will be shown in our online directory exactly as you type it, so please confirm your details. If you wish to withhold any information, please check the proper box. If you add a website listing, your site will automatically be added to our members' gallery section, which will provide one-click access to your site.

- Also, as CWA depends on its volunteers, please review and keep current the Volunteer section to see what we are showing as your areas of interest for volunteering.
- When you submit to pay, you will be sent to our secure PayPal site, where you can pay by Credit Card, Debit Card, or PayPal.
 You receive confirmation emails from both CWA and PayPal.
- If for any reason you choose not to use the PayPal site, you
 will be able to print out your details and email the form with a
 check to CWA.

If your membership has expired, you will automatically be sent to the renewal screen.

- Please confirm that your details are correct, or make any changes desired to your personal information or volunteer choices.
- When you submit the online form, you will be sent to our secure PayPal site to pay your dues.
- Where you can pay by Credit Card, Debit Card, or PayPal.
 You receive confirmation emails from both CWA and PayPal.
- If for any reason you choose not to use the PayPal site, you
 will be able to print out your details and email the form with a
 check to CWA.
- Once you have paid, your information will be updated in our database, and your website added to our Members' Gallery.

Later you'll see more benefits, like when it comes to signing up for the upcoming John Muir show in February next year. Our system now will let you sign up online for the shows, upload and re-size your images. We also will be able to have slide shows of our accepted paintings and offer them for sales on our sales site, which today only has catalogs and aprons.

In a previous report I mentioned better linkage to members' websites. Anytime you add your website to your member details, it will automatically create a link and add you to our Members' Gallery site. Over time, we hope to offer thumbnail images of members' work and more informative links.

In addition to the member benefits, organizationally, CWA will gain a lot of capability to improve our operations. Once isolated pockets of information will be better linked and we will gain better reporting tools for managing the business.

We hope that you will use the new site and offer suggestions of things you might like to see. This is your organization and we need your feedback. Please let us know what you think.
