Kathleen Conover's class, Chaos to Order, is designed to help strengthen students' compositional skills, wherever they are in painting experience. Attendees will get to bring paintings from colorful and textured "chaos" to "order" with good design. Conover will give daily demonstrations, design-strengthening exercises, and share new painting techniques. <u>CWA \$395, non \$450.</u>

An ex-Californian, Upper Michigan has been Kathleen's home for 30+ years, and the inspiration for much of her work, such as her Frozen Crystals series. She is a founding artist of Michigan's The Studio Gallery. Conover's work shows Michigan's dramatic nature: its severity and beauty, its abstract forms and concepts and its natural complexities. "Freezing my watercolors in winter to see what I can 'catch' is a wonderful mix of natural forces and human intervention," Conover states. ### Katherine Chang Liu 5 Days February 14-18 "Open Studio" Workshop – Intermediate/Advanced



CWA's first quest artist for 2011 will be Katherine Chang Liu, our 42nd National Exhibition Juror. An internationally known painter, juror, and teacher, she is a full-time exhibiting artist who has been featured in 19 books and 30+ magazines. Liu is an abstract painter, printmaker, and collage artist of international repute.

As in the acclaimed Taos Intensive Studies Seminar, Katherine's workshop is designed to address a common struggle - experienced artists at a crossroads, with the technical knowledge and experience, but who have yet to find their own voices. Liu's focus is to help artists make their work more personal. She will have one-on-one discussions about the strength and direction of each student's work, covering prior work and work done during the class, and end with a group critique session. CWA & non-CWA \$585.

Liu's work has appeared in many national shows, galleries and publications, such as NWS and the National Academy of Arts and Letters. She has received a grant from National Endowment for the Arts, had 37 solo shows, and juried over 80 exhibitions. Figure Workshop – Intermediate/Advanced				

Don Andrews is a nationally known watercolor artist and workshop instructor, with 25+ years teaching workshops on figures and landscapes in the US and abroad. Don is an active member and past board director of AWS and the recipient of numerous national awards, including three from AWS.

Our workshop will focus on addressing the figure as the subject for a painting with the same artistic freedom and looseness as when painting other subjects in nature. As Don says, "successful figure painting

is more than a visual explanation of anatomical parts." In this class, we will explore the figure through color, design, and paint guality as well as the "detail". The class is geared to experienced painters looking for a challenge and who are looking to add looseness and an expressive paint quality to their work. CWA members \$425 & non-CWA \$480.



Don is the author of Interpreting the Figure in Watercolor, Rough Sketches: Short Stories of a Traveling Artist, and his latest, Interpreting the Landscape in Watercolor. Janet Rogers	5 Days	April 18-22
Expressive Flowers	, Faces & Figure	s – All Levels

Janet Rogers, well known for her sensitive portraits of women and children, as well as her expressive floral paintings, will give a class with demonstrations on painting fresh flowers, portraiture and figures. She will work with each student individually, and there will be group "show & tell" sessions. As a teacher, her goal is to enable students to find their connections with watercolor in new and expressive ways, including



working with new color and design, applying transparent flesh tones, and finding the "life" in paintings. CWA members \$395, non-CWA \$450.

Rogers has gained much popularity as an instructor for watercolor workshops held in the United States and Europe. Janet's work can be found in Galleries in Maine and Florida, as well as in the book The One-Hour Watercolorist by Patrick Seslar (published by North Light), and her DVDs.

Janet Rogers has won numerous awards for her watercolors, including awards from the Florida Watercolor Society, of which she is a Signature Member. She is also a Signature Membership of the American Watercolor Society (AWS), and a Member with Excellence of the South Carolina Watercolor Society. Jeannie McGuire May 16-20 5 Days **Figurative Design – All Levels** 

Jeannie McGuire's passion is creating "figurative works" --strong watercolor paintings of people that illuminate personalities, explore character and play with persona. Impressionistic in nature, her work focuses on creating identifiable subjects but not traditional portraits. Jeannie was an award winner in both the 2009 and 2010 CWA National Exhibitions (2010 winner shown below).



In McGuire's workshop we will focus on developing individual style and on depicting figures or faces using watercolor in non-traditional ways. Jeannie places a strong emphasis on design, contrast, paint consistency and the sense of an emotion or story of the figure(s). Her workshops are intended for artists of all mediums and levels, and she will demonstrate how versatile watercolor can be.

As an example, we will be painting with a higher ratio of pigment to water, and experiencing different surfaces of paper and pigment properties. ### Cheng-Khee Chee September 19-23 5 Days Watercolor: Synthesizing East & West - All Levels

One of the finest watercolor artists in America, Cheng-Khee Chee, Associate Professor Emeritus of the University of Minnesota, is a Dolphin Fellow of AWS, signature member of NWS, TWSA (Master Status), Watercolor USA Honor Society and many others. Chee has won 200+ awards during his career. A Chinese native educated in Singapore, he came to the US in 1962. His East and West experiences and influences have shaped Chee's artistic career.

CWA's own David Savellano will teach a class on the basics of travel sketching and watercolor techniques that enable you to record your unique travel memories. Traveling with a sketchbook allows you to draw, paint and see the world in new and creative ways. You'll learn to capture the essence of a scene with spontaneous lines and color.

### David Savellano 3 Days June 14-16 Travel Sketching & Plein Air Painting – All Levels

This workshop will include daily painting classes, both in the studio and plein aire, with demonstrations and helpful critiques to prepare you for your next trip. We will review basic drawing, perspective, people, buildings, cityscapes, and landscapes. Basic drawing skills are recommended, but all are welcome. CWA \$245, non \$295.

Chee believes that artists should be constantly exploring, experimenting and discovering the changes in the world around them, and developing new concepts and ways of expression. In this class Chee will introduce students to many techniques, including the saturated wet process, his improvisational approaches, crinkling, marbleizing and mono-printing techniques. Subject matters will be objective and non-objective.
