April Guest Artist David Savellano, NWS



CWA welcomes David Savellano to our April 16th general meeting. David will be our April workshop artist, with a plein air workshop around our beautiful Bay Area, from April 17 to 19. Working primarily en plein air, David creates watercolor paintings that capture random moments—on the street, in nature, and wherever else his portable easel takes him. "I enjoy working outdoors because it's unpredictable and lends itself to a kind of spontaneity you just can't get in a studio," he says.

Painting outdoors, especially in the urban settings he favors, requires adaptability and above all speed. Usually the elements are a factor, like the changing light (or more dramatically, the onset of a thunderstorm); and the most alluring subjects/scenarios are often fleeting or temporary at best.

The challenges involved in painting outside are essential to what makes this peculiar art form so vital, and a big part of David's efforts to create the feeling and energy of spontaneous work. "When you paint outdoors, you're completely immersed in the scene—the atmosphere, the mood," says David. "You're just soaking it in, feeling the subject—empathy—and actually capturing its essence. When I look at one of my paintings, I feel the energy of that place or scene like I was there yesterday. Ultimately, that's the feeling I'm trying to induce in others who see my work."

David lives in the Bay Area and is a native Californian, which is reflected in the sun-dappled streets and waterfront imagery that dominate his work. Although largely self-taught as a watercolor

painter, he credits his 30 years as a practicing architect with having given him the drawing skills and strong sense of perspective that have elevated his artwork to a professional level.

David's passion for outdoor painting isn't limited to his own sketches and paintings, he also teaches it, offering classes distinguished by their intimate size and the generous amount of personal instruction he provides. His expert instruction enables students to improve their artistic skills and knowledge.

Art critic Brian Sherwin commented on David's artwork, stating "Artist David Savellano's artwork reveals the harmony that can be found between controlled marks spurred by dedication and spontaneity, bold marks that can only be made by an artist who is comfortable working loosely." Sherwin adds, "David's artwork is the perfect meshing of controlled marks and loose marks 'fueled' by split second instinct. That energy which involves critical thinking and a keen eye for observation serves as the essence of his practice."

In addition to the CWA general meeting, David has also been invited to give a presentation for the Society of Western Artists in September, and will be the Juror for WASCO's 20th annual exhibition (Watercolor Artists of Sonoma County).

David's work has been included in articles such as Use Sketches to Build a Sense of Place (Author: James Duncan, Publication: Watercolor, American Artist Publication, Summer 2011) and Urban Impressions (Author: Deborah Secor, Publication: Watercolor Artist, 2010).

David will be doing other workshops in the Bay Area later this year:

- Travel Sketching/Journaling, in June, Knowlton Gallery in Lodi, CA
- Plein Air Watercolor Painting in Redwood City, CA in October for the Society of Western Artists

This painting was painted by a man who had no legs and in a wheelchair. He needed to lean back to take breaths in order to continue painting. He was so determined. During his painting he would be interrupted by an aide needing to prick a finger in his other hand in order to take blood samples. After I handed him his finished card he looked up to me in amazement. With his eyes and all his heart said "thank you." I said "no, Thank you for serving." With that he took his little card and carefully lifted the strap that held on his prostheses and tucked in his card. For a moment in time he forgot his pain and the horrors of war.



This sunflower painting was painted by a man that when he sat down appeared to be very nervous and agitated. Carefully he drew his circles so very small. I encouraged him to try and draw his circles bigger which he did. He drew the petals very small. So insecure and scared he was especially when it came time to paint yellow in the petals. I kept reassuring him it was okay to let the paint go outside of the lines. He took the longest time painting wanting to make things perfect, so scared he would do something wrong. He too, when presented with his beautiful card, looked up and said "thank you." For a moment in time perhaps he put his PTS aside.

This painting was painted by a spirited smiley chap in spite that he was in a wheelchair and seemed to be in pain. He was sure he could not do this. I looked over at his right hand which lay limp and motionless. I asked him if he was right handed or left. "Right" he said. So I taped the paper to the table so it did not move. He laughed and had fun with his new found friend next to him. He was amazed when I presented him with his masterpiece. He looked up and said "did I do that?"

At one point I looked across the room seeing all the Vets leaned over intently concentrating on their little sunflower paintings. There also were my co-helpers Maryann, Sheila and Victoria in their little blue CWA aprons working diligently helping our Veterans painting, blow drying the paintings, taping to folded cards and putting in clear sleeves.
