

# June Workshop Instructor David Lobenberg



David Lobenberg is a person of many drawings and paintings; and, when it comes to his blog (http://davidlobenberg.blogspot.com/), he is a person of many thoughts on artistic process, along with painting tips and paintings photographed at various steps to completion. Something else to know about David is that he enjoys working in monotone color so much, that he has made a 75-minute DVD on the subject: "Portraiture In Payne's Gray." Should you ask, why "Payne's Gray," the answer would be that Winsor and Newton's Payne's Gray is his favorite color. Why monotone? He would answer, "Color IS value, but if you cannot control value, I firmly believe that you cannot master representational painting."

About David's new DVD, Nicholas Simmons has said, "David Lobenberg possesses what I call the 'portrait gene.' He has a special talent for creating loose, spontaneous, fresh and lively portraits that not only appear as though they just 'happened,' but also capture a wonderful likeness -- a deceptively difficult thing to accomplish. Whether he works in watercolor or acrylic, the paintings still look wet, a very important quality for me. In this demonstration, David takes a relaxed approach explaining his process -- and even more importantly, his thinking -- while putting

down washes with the barest essentials of a drawing for guidance. He also wisely confines himself to one color so that the critical aspects of value and shape are highlighted. I learned a lot from watching it, and it will bear repeated viewings. Highly recommended!"

David Lobenberg's high level of excellence in figurative and landscape water color and acrylic painting is well recognized by artists and collectors. He has completed commissioned works for California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger, The United States Air Force Thunderbirds Association, The Amgen Tour of California, professional baseball players Barry Zito and Nick Swisher, The Sacramento Kings, the IMAX Corporation, and SureWest, to name a few. In 1999, he illustrated a book on JFK: John Fitzgerald Kennedy Jr.: An American Album by Peggy J. Howe, Charlotte Krause and David Lobenberg.

With a Master of Fine Arts from UCLA, David has been an adjunct art professor teaching drawing classes at Sacramento City College for twelve years, and has been teaching art workshops for more than 25 years in California, Nevada, and Washington state. Next year, he will be teaching a major watercolor portrait workshop for The Santa Clara Valley Watercolor Society. In 2011, David published a booklet on a subject which he loves to teach: "On – The – Go Ink and Wash Sketching with Confidence and Ease."

In his 2-day CWA workshop, David will cover the six primary skill sets of drawing: Angles, proportion (or size), position, contours, values, and shapes. He will present, discuss and demonstrate each skill set, then follow up with an exercise specifically designed to effectively practice that skill set. Note that ALL



necessary drawing supplies and objects to draw will be provided. CWA is very excited to have this experienced teacher instructing us on drawing, an important skill for any painter and one which most of us need to continue to develop to create successful art.

### DAVID LOBENBERG Mastering the Six Skill Sets of Drawing







Considered a gifted art teacher, he is noted for his ability to articulate the elements and principles of design. He devised and taught a class at the University of California at Santa Cruz Extension, "Watercolor Beyond the Obvious," based on the principles of design and developing one's art through series work. He is a popular workshop instructor across the USA and occasionally in Europe.

#### Venue

The Harrington Gallery, in the Firehouse Arts Center, 4444 Railroad Avenue, Pleasanton, California, features the works of renowned visual artists of regional and national stature in painting, sculpture, installations, and conceptual art. Old Fire Station Number One, established in 1888, served downtown Pleasanton well for many years. This rebuilt facility became the basis for the Firehouse Arts Center, including a portion of the original building with brick walls preserved within the gallery space. The gallery is adjacent to Wayside Park and just a few steps off Main Street in the heart of downtown Pleasanton.

#### **Eligibility**

The 43<sup>rd</sup> National Exhibition is open to all artists 18 years or older. Paintings must be two-dimensional and primarily of water-based media on paper surface; watercolor canvas, Yupo, and Tyvek are acceptable. Pastel or collage may be used as long as **water-media is the dominant element**. No digital media, photography, prints, or reproductions. Source material and composition must be wholly original and not derived from any published images. Entries must be recent works completed within the last two years, entirely the work of the artist, and not shown previously in a CWA National Exhibition. No workshop or class work. Artists who fail to provide an accepted entry are disqualified from the next three CWA National Exhibitions.

#### **Size Limits**

Minimum Image: 140 square inches, no side less than 10 inches

Maximum Frame, outside dimensions: 40"x40"

Maximum Weight: 40 lbs.

#### **Framing**

All paintings must be framed in simple, square-cornered frames ready for hanging and protected under Plexiglas. Mats (optional) must be white or off white. Colored liner mats accepted. Additional details will be included in instructions to accepted artists.

#### **Online Entries Only**

To enter, go to www.californiawatercolor.org, click "Shows/Exhibitions," then "National Prospectus" for online submission details. Artists may enter up to three images submitted as digital files only. Images must be jpegs in RGB format (not CYMK), with 1200 pixels on the longest side, one painting per file. Show only the image without mat or frame. Label the image file with: Lastname\_Firstname\_Painting Title, i.e. (Doe\_Jane\_Bouquet of Roses.jpg).

#### **Entry Fees (non-refundable)**

Entry fee is payable on PayPal by credit, debit, or individual account. CWA members: \$35 for one image, \$5 each additional image, maximum of three images. Non-members: \$45 for one image, plus \$5 each additional image, maximum of three images. Those wishing to join CWA may add \$45 annual dues during the entry process. Benefits of membership, effective for one year from date of payment, are at www.californiawatercolor.org.

#### **Accepted Entries**

Only one entry per artist may be accepted. All artists will be notified by email and posted online after October 15, 2012. Artists with accepted artwork may be asked for a higher resolution image for the catalog. Full instructions for shipping will be attached to the acceptance email. All accepted paintings will have a handling fee of \$45. Accepted work must match submitted image; paintings not consistent with submitted image may be disqualified. All accepted paintings will be represented in the catalog. Each Exhibition entrant will receive a complimentary catalog. Additional catalogs will be available for purchase.

#### **Sales**

The Firehouse Arts Center will handle all painting sales and retain a 30% commission.

#### **Conditions and Liabilities**

No work may be withdrawn before the end of the exhibit. CWA and the Harrington Gallery reserve the right to photograph artwork or copy images for promotional purposes. Insurance coverage is the artist's sole responsibility, both in transit and during the exhibit. Neither CWA nor the Harrington Gallery insures the artwork and neither shall be responsible for loss or damage to any artwork submitted. Accepted artists must sign a release of liability. The submission of entries to this competition shall constitute an agreement on the part of the artist to the terms and conditions as set forth in this prospectus.




