March Demo Artist Birgit O'Connor

Dramatically stunning florals are O'Connor's specialty, but she also paints wonderfully atmospheric landscapes and has developed unique techniques for painting rocks, sand and seaglass. "Everything has a voice that not everyone can hear, the form is the language, the content the voice..."

Birgit is a self taught artist who developed herself while she was also a full time wife and mother. Finding inspiration near her home in Bolinas, California, her award-winning work has been recognized and published in over 24 national and international artist publications, including Australian Artist and International Artist Magazine. Birgit contributes regularly to Watercolor Magic, Artist Sketch, Watercolor Basics, and Artist magazine and has been featured in articles in The San Francisco Chronicle, Marin IJ, Pt. Reves Light, and The New York Times. She is a member of the California Watercolor Society, Northern California Chapter of the Women's Caucus of Art, Marin Art Council, Bolinas Living Artists, Louisiana Watercolor Society, Who's who in America, and Who's Who in American Woman. Birgit has shown her work all over the world including a one woman show in Hong Kong.

Currently she is represented in Hong Kong; the Gallery Mack Inc. in Seattle, WA, and Palm Desert, CA; the Atherton Gallery in Atherton, CA; and the Royce Gallery in Denver.

About painting florals, Birgit says, "Each of us has the choice of simply seeing a flower or something much more. I am intrigued by the character I find in plants, something most would find unusual in such a traditionally passive subject. I love to take a flower and enhance its drama, which can allow you to view it in a completely different way. A small and delicate blossom, which would normally be unnoticed, can become intimidating or evoke an incredibly passionate response." "Fascinated with depth, shadow and movement,



I found that the watercolor medium gave me a feeling of working with subconscious emotion, that the flower itself became a vehicle for color and form.."



Birgit has mastered glazing and color blending on paper for achieving seamless color shifts and multiple depths without any detectable lines of transition, except where she decides to put them. Given the scale on which she works, this is an impressive skill and one which she will be transmitting to her workshop students. She frequently writes articles for magazines with guidance on different painting techniques, i.e., glazing and color; the articles are as well-organized and full of content as are her workshops; see her website for a list. We look forward to her demonstration at the March meeting, where we can join her for a painting journey into a flower.

ENTRIES: Two paintings may be submitted by each member. Entry fee is \$10 per painting. To enter, log into our web site, go to the members home page and click on the lower right link. Original, recent water media on paper or Yupo. No copies and no class work. Paintings must be framed in metal or wood, covered with Plexiglas, wired and ready to hang. No sawtooths, clamps or screw eyes. Flat brackets are required on wood frames. No cardboard or masking tape. No wide or Rococo frames. White or off white mats only. Minimum frame size is 12" x 18". Maximum size is 35" x 35". Due to gallery preference, the show hanging will be on March 18 and judging will take place on the 20th. If a painting doesn't make it into the show for some reason, you will be notified to pick it up after this date.

GALLERY SITTING: If we can get CWA volunteers for weekend shifts, the gallery members will open the gallery for us on weekend hours. So when you enter, please list the dates and times you can gallery sit on a Saturday or Sunday. If we get two or more per shift, we can request the gallery to be open for that day.

LABELS: Please print labels from the website. They can be found under the Membership tab, then "forms", and then "Labels to be on paintings submitted to shows". Follow the instructions on the labels when you tape them to the back of your paintings.

SALES: All sales will be made through the artist. All paintings must hang for the duration of the show. The artist is then responsible for a 10% commission to PACO and a 15% outreach donation to CWA.

INSURANCE: Your paintings will be handled with the best of care, however, CWA, PACO and their volunteers assume no responsibility for theft, loss or damage of any kind. Insurance is the sole responsibility of the artist.



On February 7, Sheila Cain did an Outreach with Brownie Troop #30890 at Clayton Elementary School. I assisted her and learned a great deal on the Heart Theme. Everything was about hearts in all shapes and all possible colors.

14 young artists fearlessly grabbed their brushes. They drew hearts with wax candles, reserving a space for something magical to happen. The real miracle occurred when Sheila taught them the wet-on-wet technique. When the paint was generously applied, the hearts started showing up. Just like when we are kind and grateful, our hearts are revealed and attract more beauty.

The second part of the lesson was about the illustration. Sheila showed to the kids how using their imagination, with just three primary colors, they can paint a Love Fish made of hearts. I started feeling as if I was at the bottom of a Magnificent Sea with 14 lovely fish of all shapes and kinds swimming in a water-of-color.

When we placed the completed painting outside the classroom to dry, we created a spontaneous art show where each artwork was a jewel of a colorful kaleidoscope.
