November Guest Artist Claire Schroeven Verbiest, CWA



Claire works in watercolor, pastel, collage and acrylics. She says of her approach to painting that light and color are the two main motivators for putting paint on paper or canvas and that in her watercolors she is fond of subject matter set against a large and plain background, as the latter provides her with an opportunity to paint freely and intuitively. She finds texture as well as dramatic light and high contrasts of value and color very compelling.

Claire is a Belgian native who lived in the Congo and in Germany before moving to San Jose, California with her husband and their two children. An award-winning artist and a signature member of several societies, Claire is considered one of the finest watercolor and pastel artists in the

San Francisco Bay Area. She is well known for her lively, crisp and colorful depictions of people, landscapes, flowers and objects and for her distinctive use of col-



or. She no longer teaches but if often asked to judge for local and regional shows. In 1997, her "Chili sans Carne" watercolor received the Best of Show prize at the CWA Annual and in May and June 2007, 29 of her pastel paintings were on display in a solo exhibition at the Triton Museum of Art in Santa Clara, California.


















Outstanding Outreach

September of this year had perhaps the most fruitful Outreach program in whole history of CWA. More than hundred art lovers were introduced to the various watercolor techniques in total of seven Outreach sessions in three different cities in one month!

Besides the ongoing semiweekly outreach for VA recreation therapy department in Martinez, which was taught by Sheila Cain and Victoria Bianco; a team of eight artists collaborated for an Open Studio event at Walt Disney Family Museum in San Francisco, Maria Batkova, Sheila Cain, Victoria Chiofalo, Joan Gombos, Iretta Hunter, Sue Johnston, Samantha McNally, and Irina Sztukowski presented various projects there. Bringing their talents and enthusiasm these artists gave instructions, painted alongside with museum guests, and promoted their love of watercolor. Together, all four sessions at the museum became a great mix of celebration of the Fall season, upcoming holidays, and the current exhibition Water to Paper, Paint to Sky. These Outreach sessions were held on the weekends between September 7 and 15.

On September 27, Irina Sztukowski with assistance of her husband organized a watercolor lesson for 36 students of Western Christian School in Hanford, CA. Irina instructed young artists how to paint a colorful landscape with the water reflections in watercolor. When the first project with Wet-On-Wet landscape was completed, brave artists fearlessly moved into an illustrative assignment. Within an hour of the lesson, each child ended up with an artwork ready to be framed and a cute greeting card. Everyone had lots of fun. The learning process was a pure enjoyment, and all students' creations were colorful, unique and beautiful. Supplies for this lesson were provided by CWA.


