January Guest Artist Gary Bukovnik



I was fascinated by flowers from an early age. My great grand mother had a rose garden into which no children were admitted. I was perhaps two when I was allowed to enter, hands behind my back so as not to touch, and allowed only to smell the blossoms. Sometimes she would give me the fallen petals which thrilled me.

Most children start to draw with crayons and finger paint but for me it was watercolor. My mother covered the kitchen table with many layers of newspaper and then I was allowed to paint.

When I was just four, we moved in with my grandmother who had a general store in the country near Cleveland Ohio. All around were nurseries, growing plants and flowers destined for shipping around the country, so I was literally surrounded by flowers.

Many artists choose subject matter and medium but I feel that I was chosen by both. At first I tried to escape this destiny, but as time went by, after my move to San Francisco, it reclaimed me. I was in a gallery at Civic Center when the owner called me into his office. I was sure he was about to ask me to leave his stable of artists, but I was wrong. I had come to California to paint only landscapes as that seemed to me more "art" than flowers; however the gallery owner wanted me to paint FLOWERS, much to my surprise and dismay. It seemed to me a sad state of the inescapable. But I wanted to make my way in the world and pay the rent, so I reluctantly returned to my first love. A wonderful discovery is that all along as I had heard of artistic suffering and the searching for one's self — when there it was - I had it: subject, medium and I became inseparable from life.

I have always felt that all the things to which we are attracted or admire in life become the essence of an artist's uniqueness. Each individual person —even though having similar influences — is his or her own particular mix — in choice and proportion of those things. It is what makes each an individual. For me some of the greatest influences — other artists like Matisse, Degas, Alfons Mucha, Charles Demuth, Mark Rothko, Robert Motherwell, Paul Wonner, Mark Adams have all left their imprint on style, choice, or technique — then there is Music which fills my life — composers Haydn and Richard Strauss head the list for me — these are the ingredients of my aesthetic.

Although I paint flowers exclusively for exhibition, a love of drawing enriches my life and affects my work in subtle ways. I like to think that a painting can be viewed in several ways. Representation of three-dimensional objects segues into abstraction when conceptions and perceptions are put on paper. The paintings are all me—aspects of portraiture. That picture mood and views are about life.

I have been painting in San Francisco since 1974 and have been growing as a person and, I hope, as an artist. Early in this decade I went to Italy to be a visiting artist at the American Academy in Rome — an event that changed my life. Due at first to a shipping mishap — I was forced to paint without my usual materials. Encourage by many incredible people I met there, my work began to cease being still: the flowers and their containers began to move and fly.

Just as my art was changing so did I. I found that this new-to-me way of looking at things has offered much opportunity to evolve personally and as an artist. Now free of old constraints — flowers, vases, water; anything can fly and make comments about the world in ways I could not previously have dreamed.

That brings me to the present and my newest discovery of Asia: essentially watercolor shares a kinship with

Asian art: thought before action. I am very excited to see a new door begin to open to me and I wonder — if Rome taught me to fly free — what will I learn and where will I go now from immersion in China and Japan? At my age, I feel again that life is just beginning.



Judy Morris Good Design...Hidden In Plain Sight 5 Days/February 17 to 21

"My painting philosophy is very simple. I paint because I can't stop. I don't know exactly when I became obsessed with watercolor painting. It caught me when I wasn't paying attention and changed my life."

"Good Design is hidden in plain sight. You just have to know how to find it. And I can show you how! You will learn to avoid confusion by using design concepts that work. Together we will find the underlying concepts that work...Every successful painting has an underlying structure that ensures success or creates visual problems."

Judy will provide logical explanations of the elements and principles of design, teach you how to use "inspiration without imitation", color chords that create harmony, texture techniques that add surface interest to your painting, painting techniques that make you smile throughout the painting process, and finally, finishing techniques that make your painting a winner!

Every artist wants a successful painting. Every successful painting has an underlying structure that ensures success or creates visual problems. She will help you discover the most effective painting path for your painting style. Class time will be balanced between demonstrations, discussions, and painting time with individual help. The workshop will end with a formal critique of work completed in class.

Judy has achieved much during her 45 years as a painter and teacher. She is a signature member of AWS, NWS, TWSA, and NWWS, and a popular juror and workshop teacher. Judy teaches throughout the US and internationally (Mexico, England, Switzerland, France, Italy and Japan).

Widely recognized, Judy Morris was one of only 15 American artists included in the 2011 Taiwan International Watercolor Exhibition, and one of only 125 non-Chinese artists from 62 countries selected for the 2012 Shanghai Zhujiajiao International Watercolor Biennial Exhibition. In 2012, Judy was also very pleased to be invited by Cheng-Khee Chee to exhibit in the Third Invitational Exhibition of Contemporary International Watermedia Masters at the Jiangsu Province Art Museum in Nanjing and Tianjin City, China in 2012 as well.

Morris, as a recipient of 50+ national and regional awards, has seen her works selected for AWS, NWS, and TWSA exhibitions. Judy has had numerous feature articles in national publications, including INTERNA-TIONAL ARTIST MAGAZINE. Her work has been included in more than a dozen recent watercolor books and publications, nine SPLASH books, including the recent SPLASH RETROSPECTIVE, covering 20+ years of contemporary watercolor.


2014 CWA APRIL WORKSHOP



David Savellano Plein Air: Landscape, Seascape & Cityscape 3 Days/April 17 to 19

In April, it is time for "Plein Air" with David Savellano. A CWA member and native Californian, David Savellano is an artist who works primarily en plein air, creating watercolor paintings that capture random moments—on the street, in nature, and wherever else his portable easel takes him.

"I enjoy working outdoors because it's unpredictable and lends itself to a kind of spontaneity you just can't get in a studio...When you paint outdoors, you're completely immersed in the scene—the atmosphere, the mood."

David is an architect and largely self-taught watercolorist with excellent drawing skills and a strong sense of perspective that have elevated his artwork to a professional level. As his many students will attest, he is also a very skillful and inspirational teacher with a very accessible approach to plein air painting.

David will begin with a half-day lecture on plein air painting, his approach, materials, and equipment. At each of three sites, David will choose a scene to paint and students will gather around and paint along with him in a stepby-step method. By observing (taking photos


