

from the president Meeting Your Inspiration





Looking for Inspiration

A question appeared in my email this month "where do you find inspiration as a painter?" I don't think of this question as directed at me personally, but something that painters consider in general. But the question started me on a series of reflections.

Lately, I have been meeting with a friend, once a week to talk about the paintings we love. We have kind of an art date that we both enjoy. In the process, we are acknowledging the works that speak most clearly to us. Something in a painting sings out to me and I find that I am happy looking and continuing to look. In sharing and talking about the paintings we love, we are both gaining insights into painting, into viewing paintings, and into inspiration.

Oddly enough, I often feel that I catch a glimpse of how the artist was feeling as he worked. Karl Knausgaard (2015) says "All writers, artists and musicians know the feeling: when you disappear into what you are doing, lose yourself in it and are no longer aware that you exist, while at the same time the feeling of existing is profound and total and what you make is never better."

I have the sense the painting on the right (an art date selection nominated by my friend) might have come out of an experience similar to the one Knausgaard describes. Colorful and abstract, the image exudes an elemental energy. I catch a distant echo of Serusier, the passionate and fearless painter who abstracted this image of a river flowing into the Woods of Love. The coherence of the image might reflect Serusier's sense of energy, power, and wholeness in the moment.

I started thinking about my best experiences of painting where I am in touch with something precious to me. My worries about being perfect, painting well, and even finishing the painting are gone and I am suspended in the moment, completely happy and completely focused. The work that comes out of those experiences is usually my best work. Paradoxically, I have to stop thinking about making a good painting and just paint.

I am wondering about all of you dear readers, where do you find inspiration as a painter? What means the most to you about painting? I would love to hear your thoughts.

Notes on Serusier

Sérusier painted the Talisman and was influenced by Gauguin. Sérusier returned to Paris to organize a group of artists known as the Nabis (prophets). Bonnard, Vuillard, and others were members

of Nabis. The entire group used surface for decorative effects rather than creating value or dimensions through perspectives. Sérusier and the Nabis suggested that a painting was a flat construct of various materials on which paint was placed rather than a living image of the world. They were enthusiastically revolutionary for the time and made Gauguin an honorary member of the group.

Notes about paintings coming near us: To celebrate the wonderful Turner show coming here June 20 through September 20, 2015. The Legion of Honor has planned a follow up event. The museum will be presenting an exhibit featuring drawings, watercolors, and oil sketches by Joseph Mallord William Turner and his contemporaries, including Thomas Gainsborough, John Robert Cozens, William Blake, John Constable, John Martin, and Samuel Palmer. This event is planned for July 11 –November 29, 2015.


