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

September Guest Artist Jean Pederson





Jean Pederson (AWS, MCWA) is our guest artist for the September general meeting and our workshop artist September 19-22. This workshop, *Expressive Portraits: Creative Methods for Painting People* (Intermediate/Advanced), will delve into the exploration of various combinations of mixed media, with an emphasis on water soluble paints and mediums vis a vis the human face and figure. We will be exploring everything from watercolor to gouache, gesso, acrylics, inks, mark-making tools, collage and much more, to see how they can be applied to figure painting and we will be painting live models. In the *Dear Elizabeth* column of our May newsletter, Liz Johnston introduced us to Jean Pederson. Liz properly described her as "*painter of complexity*" – she is an artist of rich talent who uses the richness of water media in all its forms to create her beautiful works. Although Jean is renowned for her portraits and figurative work, the focus this workshop, she is also very skilled in florals, landscapes and abstracts.

Pederson has been painting for over twenty years, balancing her strong teaching abilities and writing with her continuing aspiration to convey her ideas in visual form. She has exhibited her work in China, England, Sweden, New York, San Francisco, Mexico and across Canada, and is the author of "Expressive Portraits: Creative Methods for Painting People" North Light Books has approved her to write a second book. Jean has been honored with numerous national and international awards. In 2005, she was the first recipient of the Federation of Canadian Artists Early Achievement Award, granted for her many honors, awards, international writing to promote art education, and consistently exceptional painting.

Jean's traditional practice includes referential imagery of people, still life, landscape and abstraction. In addition to watercolor, Jean uses the layering of a variety of media to create an assortment of possibilities within her work, e.g., quality of edge, line and texture all play a role within her imagery. Although a master of watercolors, mixed media has become an important venue for her creative expression.


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The portraits in her paintings are based on people who she has met or impacted her. These subjects in her paintings often reflect different walks of life as well as diverse cultural and religious backgrounds. We are hard pressed to find a period in time when the human figure wasn't represented. Finding a way to express the human figure in a language that reflects the twenty-first century is perhaps the greatest challenge in figurative work today.

Jean's work has been placed in the Royal Collection in Winsor, England, and she has been honored with numerous National and International awards over the years. Pederson has exhibited her work in China, London, Stockholm, New York (United Nations, Metropolitan Museum of Art, Guggenheim, the Museum of Modern Art), San Francisco, Mexico and across Canada.

Sponsored by Holbein, Jean has received many awards. In addition to being a Master Signature Member of CWA, she is a Silver award winner and signature member of the American Watercolor Society, as well as organizations in her native Canada, including the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolour (C.S.P.W.C.), Alberta Society of Artists (A.S.A. Signature Member), and Federation of Canadian Artists (SFCA Senior Signature Member).

Pederson is a graduate of the University of Calgary (Major in Fine Arts) and a previous award winner in our own National Exhibitions, winning the 2001 Silver award and 2011 Juror's award. She was also an award winner in 2008 in the AWS's 141st International Exhibition, a Finalist in *The Artist's Magazine* – Experimental category and also in the magazine's Portrait category, a previous TWSA and NWWS award winner, and frequent participant in many exhibitions across Canada, the US, and multiple times in the China International Invitational Water Media Exhibition, Jiangsu Water Color Institute.



Jean has a long history as a workshop and art teacher, and previously has been the Windsor and Newton teaching Contributing Editor for *The Artist's Magazine*. For more information on Jean, visit her website at www.jeanpederson.com



from the president "Creativity Takes Courage"

By the time you read this, I will have thrown my "hat" into the ring... by this I mean I've entered my three paintings into the 47th CWA National Exhibition!

Henri Matisse told the world "Creativity Takes Courage." Henri learned that when he exhibited "Woman With a Hat" for the first time in 1905 at the Salon d'Automne. The painting caused a scandal. It was called barbaric. The painting outraged people. Matisse was called a "wild beast and a victimizer of women." The woman in the painting was his wife and she was fully clothed.

Why all the fuss?


Color!

Yes, I said color. The woman's face was all different colors! Pure colors. Her hat was all different colors. Her dress was all different colors. Matisse studied the color palette of pointillist Signac and combined that color with postimpressionistic techniques used by Cezanne and Van Gogh. It was a surprise the painting survived the exhibition, but survive it did. Gertrude and Leo Stein bought "Woman With a Hat" for full asking price just before the exhibit closed. Note, Leo Stein called it the "nastiest smear of paint I have ever seen," yet he and his sister Gertrude knew the painting was an important step forward for the modern painting movement. Eventually the infamous painting made its way into the SF MOMA collection.

I hope when you start a new painting you encourage yourself to try a new color, throw caution to the wind. You are the artist in control of your palette. Be a Matisse! I did and it felt really good!






The Arts and Culture Commission

On August 21, CWA Outreach co-director Victoria Bianco and AC5 staff member Roger Renn manned a booth promoting the About Face veteran painting project. On display were works created by veterans from the Oakland VA. Martinez Veteran, Wes Evans, did watercolor paintings crediting CWA for his growing knowledge and love of the watercolor medium. He made about \$300 averaging about \$30 dollar for each of his 10 paintings sold, all were unframed. He was happy as this was his first time selling at a venue like this. 



Co-Vice President

The Vice President shall manage the membership processes of recruitment, record membership, new member orientation and shall oversee management of petition(s) for signature membership(s). The Vice President shall be responsible for duties or special projects as may be prescribed by the President and/or CWA Board of Directors. In the absence or disability of the President, the Vice President shall perform all duties of the President; shall have signature powers over the financial accounts along with the Budget Director, which shall have the same validity and binding effect as if done by the President. The Vice President shall act as Board Liaison to the Data Manager.

Current Co-Vice Presidents are Sue Johnston and Annegret van Gemeren. Sue Johnston is retiring from the position for 2017. We are seeking her replacement.

The Budget Director


