
Oakland VA - Get Well Art

The Oakland VA painting project for June was one of heart-felt intention. The project was to create cards conveying wellness, healing and recovery. A member of our Oakland VA group, Walter Seabock, had suffered a life threatening motorcycle accident. Walter has been a long time member of the group. Over the years he's shared many life episodes besides being a veteran of the Vietnam war.

To begin we talked about subjects that might bring comfort and symbols of regeneration and spiritual wellness. Nancy had brought some poetry books which we shared for inspirational words. Then every one just started in...the silence of deep concentration descended upon us.

The collage below shows the results. They were delivered by hand to Walter in the hospital. Happily Walter has improved greatly. He even made a visit to the Oakland group assisted by his lovely wife Stacey. He reflected, "When I was in the siege of Khe Sanh in Vietnam, I thought I would die every day." After the accident "they said I'd stopped breathing and they'd brought me back to life. Yeh! I'm glad to be alive. It wasn't my time... I don't know what's next, maybe I'll write a book."

We were all delighted to see Walter so positive and recovering so well. The art we created for health and wellness may have helped Walter turn a corner. It surely helped us show that we cared and were sending him art from our hearts.
