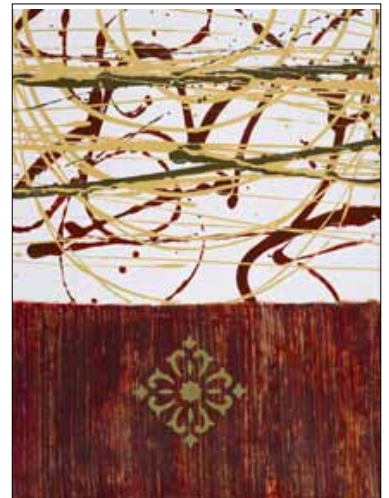


November Guest Artist Tesia Blackburn

Creative ways to use Golden acrylics
and mediums

The Golden lecture/demo is a two-hour free educational presentation on acrylic paints, gels and mediums: an advanced technical explanation of acrylics, and their inherent possibilities. It covers information about the different types of pigments, different viscosities and types of paints, grounds and color mixing.

Experience the almost limitless possibilities with the new Digital Grounds from Golden Artist Colors. Paint, print, photography, digital, handmade or reproduced: these seeming divergent media are merging as artists are experimenting with bringing them together in new, rich, and interesting ways. This class will teach you how to use the new Digital Grounds to print on acrylic paint skins, thin sheets of metal (e.g. aluminum), and a variety of other substrates. Unusual papers, foils, and actual layers of acrylic paint (paint skins) can receive printed images directly from an inkjet printer. Work on these images to transform them, seal them, and then incorporate them into existing artwork - or use them alone. Painters, collage and mixed media artists, photographers, printmakers - all can expand their image vocabulary and techniques.



Tesia Blackburn has been a working artist in the San Francisco Bay Area for over 20 years. She received her BFA from the Academy of Art in 1984, studied lithography at the San Francisco Art Institute in 1990 and received her Master's of Art in 1992 at John F. Kennedy University in Orinda, California.

Keiko Tanabe, Carol Carter, Thomas W. Schaller, Kathleen Alexander, Mark Mehaffey and Nicholas Simons have formed the North American Watercolor Artists, a group of six U.S. watercolor artists, to represent the United States in the IX International Watercolor Biennial in Mexico. The exhibition will be held at the National Museum of Watercolor in Mexico City, December 5, 2010 through February 13, 2011. Artists representing countries in five continents are participating in the Biennial, which is by invitation only. Begun in 1994, the purpose of the Biennial is to establish or enhance friendly relationships among watercolor artists and promote watercolor painting around the world.

Jane Hofstetter, a member of CWA as well as a master class watercolor teacher for the Triton Art Museum, has won some excellent recognition this year. She won a major award in the Missouri National Watercolor Exhibit in May, and taught an invitational class I Alaska this past spring. Her work will be appearing in a new book published by Northlight Books next year: "Journeys Into Abstraction" by Sue St. John. Jane's work will be on exhibit in

Her piece was also selected to be included in the NWS traveling exhibition during 2011. The exhibit will be available for viewing at the NWS Gallery in San Pedro until December 11. 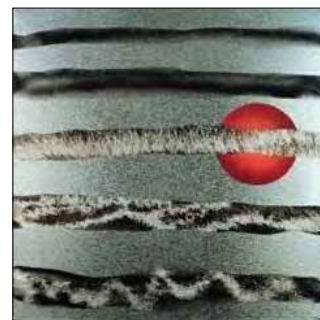

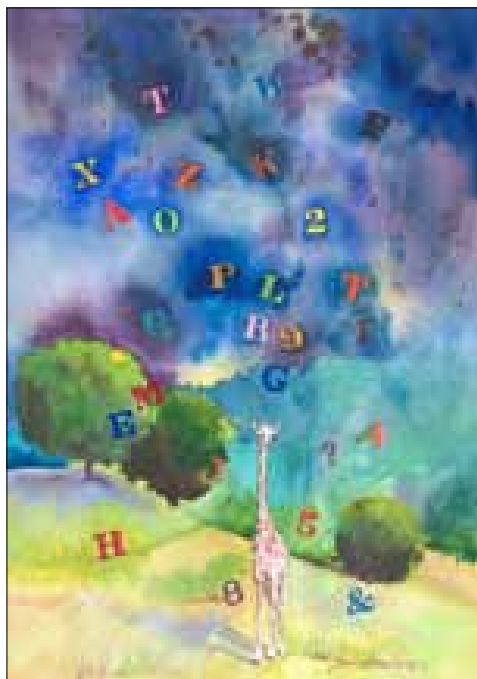

GALLERY SITTING: Artists will sign up for gallery sitting on 1 or 2 days during the show, depending on how many entries there are. Gallery hours are Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 11 am to 4 pm.

FEES: \$10.00 entry fee for each painting

INSURANCE: Your paintings will be handled with the best of care; however, CWA and Gallery Concord volunteers assume no responsibility for theft, loss or damage of any kind. Insurance is the sole responsibility of the artist.

SALES: Sales will be made through Gallery Concord and if your painting is sold you may replace it with another workshop painting. Checks will be mailed to the artist after deduction of 15%, which goes to Outreach.
