Mike Bailey = COLOR!!!

We are fortunate to have NWS 2010 President Mike Bailey as our Guest Artist for the May meeting. If you attended Mike's Watercolor Beyond the Obvious CWA workshop in 2009, you'll know why we invited him back for an unprecedented second year in a row to give his Color Workshop. This workshop has been filled for weeks now, but those of you not attending the workshop can see what all the fuss is about at our May 19th General Meeting. Mike's demonstration will be on the art of arranging a composition, devising a pattern of values, and planning a color strategy to then make the painting.

As we learn and grow as painters and artists, most of us are continually challenged to understand more about color. And there are a lot of the different manufacturers out there with their own color names, and pigment characteristics. The challenge is how to make those paints work together. Mike Bailey will help us build "fluency" with color mixing and color recognition. As Mike says, "With a palette of 20 different pigments, there are over 1,000,000 possible color mixes. Is it any wonder we are confused about color and how to put them all into a cogent and appealing painting?"

As preview to what you can expect, read about his thoughts and challenges on his fascinating website, www.mebaileyart.com. Mike shares with readers his successes and failures, which we can all relate to, such his award-winning painting at NWS getting turned away at AWS. And he's the president of NWS!



Mike writes a fascinating blog, and has a very interesting and informative website. There you can see recent works, some successful and some less so, and reads his musings on a variety of topics.

"Several years ago when attending a concert in the California Mountains, the musicians were lit with Magenta and Cyan lighting from opposing sides. In the dark, strange magenta and blue green shapes leapt off the musicians and their contorted stances. The mental images and colors still

haunt me! I tackled the idea of a series having no prior experience with painting people. Some 80 paintings were made in that series, some of which never saw the light of day. That series, though, ushered in a deluge of learning and offered so many opportunities to express emotions with color and shape. I doubt this series will ever be complete . . . it calls to me often."

While sharing his thoughts, insights, and challenges, Mike offers a lot of food for thought and some great tips. Examples of ideas he shares on his site include: Sketching with a Purpose, Manipulation of Technique and Design, Evaluating Abstractions, Still Life Variations, and Travel Journals.

Mike is a great teacher with an enthusiasm that is infectious – he obviously loves what he does, and it is almost impossible not to get caught up in the spirit he brings to teaching. It is fun and challenging to be with Bailey. Don't miss out your chance to see him in action at the May 19th meeting.



The next 41st National Committee meeting will be at Gallery Concord on Wednesday, May 12 at 7 p.m.




"Swimmin' With Susan" by Terri Hill
