February Guest Artist Katherine Chang Liu



Our February guest artist for both the General Meeting and Workshop is Katherine Chang Liu, an abstract painter and collage artist whose work is exhibited and collected internationally. Her work is introspective, subtly combining western modernism with elements of Chinese heritage.

Katherine was born in China, educated in Taiwan and the US, and received her M.S. from the University of California, Berkeley. Her work has been featured in 21 books and over 45 magazine articles. A recipient of funding from the National Endowment for the Arts, Katherine has served as a frequent juror for national, regional, and state-wide exhibitions. She has taught for museums and numerous national and regional art groups since 1978. With a long list of solo and group exhibitions, awards, and inclusion of her art in many public and private collections, Katherine is a very successful artist who also enjoys teaching, but has reduced her teaching activities to three to four workshops a year, so CWA is quite fortunate to be hosting one of those workshops.

On the subject of teaching, Katherine says, "Teaching is something I enjoy doing, starting with tutoring math to elementary school kids when I was in junior high. My belief is that teach-

ing is about the effective sharing of information, whether it is in math, science, or in art. Since 1978, I have been in the wonderful position of teaching where I want to, and working with artists in various capacities."

On her approach to teaching, Katherine says, "I pay much attention to the observation of each artist's particular intent and ability in his work, and hopefully sort things out, and guide this artist's further development. Sometimes I suggest small adjustments, and other times I try to work with the artist to find the clarification of his content, and how he might best express that content." In her CWA workshop, Katherine will be providing two private critiques for each participant, one with work brought from home and later on in the week, with work done in class.

On judging shows and creativity in painting, Katherine has stated, "Those that receive awards are the ones that really grab me. I think most of the paintings that are entered into shows that I judge are well designed and well-executed. But that is not really anything I even think about. What I look for is the artist's sincere involvement. Some artists are so removed from what they want to say that it's as if their brush couldn't have a long enough handle. They seem that detached. And some other artists will paint so close to their heart that they almost seem to be bleeding onto the page. The paintings in a show that stand out for me are usually the ones that are the most heartfelt."

Come hear Katherine's presentation on contemporary water media art in the United States at the February meeting.





Kathleen has a painting in the AWS Traveling Exhibition of 40 paintings which is currently touring the country and exhibited in Sacramento in January.






outreach news
