January Demo Artist Marcy Wheeler



Our January presenter, Marcy Wheeler, will kick off the New Year with a discussion and demonstration about pet portraits. “One of the best things about doing portraits of your beloved pets is that they never complain that you’ve made them look too fat!” says Marcy. She is a plein air painter as well as a studio artist and brings the same passion to landscape and figurative paintings. Marcy has painted her own pets, taken commissions to paint the pets of others, and is possibly best known for her “Comfy Chair” series, many of which featured her big orange cat, Charlie. Marcy will talk about different approaches to painting a pet.

Marcy was born in Chicago and received a BFA in Painting from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. After moving to California, she studied with Louise Smith, an art instructor at UC Berkeley, who was a wonderful role model for the teacher Marcy would become.

While continuing to grow with her artwork, Marcy entered the business and culinary world when she opened Toot Sweets Fine Desserts and the Edible Complex in 1975 with her future husband, Bob Kelso. Marcy displayed her paintings in her bakeries in

Berkeley, Orinda and Lafayette. She loved decorating cakes and that big batch lusciousness definitely influences her paintings today.



Marcy has been involved with many community art organizations including the Lamorinda Arts Alliance, the Lafayette Gallery, Benicia Plein Air Group and the Yosemite Conservancy. She teaches plein air painting in Yosemite one week a year.

In 2005, Marcy started the Lafayette Studio in partnership with Lamorinda Arts Alliance, where she continued to teach acrylic painting classes to adults and motivated teens, until the end of 2010, when she turned over the reins of the Lafayette Studio to Jody Matteson.

Marcy now paints and teaches ongoing classes in her new studio at 1196 Boulevard Way in Walnut Creek. To see more of her work or enquire about a class go to her website at www.MarcyWheeler.com.

Renewing Your Membership

The CWA New Website & Online Registration System is Here!

If we have an email address for you on file, by now you should have received a message with renewal instructions and your personal **USER NAME (LOG-IN ID)** and **PASSWORD**. If you haven't received it, it means the email address we have for you isn't correct. If this applies to you, please notify me by email at datamanager@californiawatercolor.org and I will take care of it right away.

Once you log in with your user name and password, you will be at the **MEMBERS ONLY** area of the website. Since memberships are about to expire, you will be notified to renew by clicking the **RED BUTTON** on the right. The **Members' Home** is the page from which you can also sign up for workshops, update your information, see the **Members' Directory**, sign up for shows and paint-outs, and change your **ID** and password.

Your unique User Name (Log-in ID) is a combination of your **First Name** and **Your CWA System ID Number**, in most cases a 4 digit number, so for example, my log-in ID might be **Anne1234**. If you lose your information, you may click on the Log-In button **in the upper right corner on the home page www.californiawatercolor.org, enter your email address and request a new one, which will be sent to the email address that we have on file for you.**

So far, about 200 of you have renewed online – THANK YOU! Our renewals are running about 4:1 online versus paper, and we're delighted that we have had very few folks needing help to make the system work (less than 5, I think). **WHILE YOUR CURRENT MEMBERSHIP WILL EXPIRE AT THE END OF DECEMBER, WE WILL GIVE EXISTING MEMBERS A GRACE PERIOD UNTIL THE END OF JANUARY TO RENEW, RECOGNIZING THAT WE HAVE A NEW SYSTEM.**

If your membership is current, you will be directed to the Member's Home page. On the right side will be a list of links to various parts of the Members' Only section.

As you renew your membership, please review and correct your information by choosing the My Details (name, address, phone, email, and website, if you have given them to us). Your information will be shown in our online directory exactly as you type it, so please confirm your details. If you wish to withhold any information, please check the proper box. If you add a website listing, your site will automatically be added to our members' gallery section, which will provide one-click access to your site. Also, as CWA depends on its volunteers, please review and keep current the Volunteer section to see what we are showing as your areas of interest for volunteering.

When you submit to pay, you will be sent to our secure PayPal site, where you can pay by Credit Card, Debit Card, or PayPal. You receive confirmation emails from both CWA and PayPal. If for any reason you choose not to use the PayPal site, you will be able to print out your details and email the form with a check to CWA.

If your membership has expired, you will automatically be sent to the renewal screen.

Please confirm that your details are correct, or make any changes desired to your personal information or volunteer choices.

When you submit the online form, you will be sent to our secure PayPal site to pay your dues, where you can pay by Credit Card, Debit Card, or PayPal. You receive confirmation emails from both CWA and PayPal. If for any reason you choose not to use the PayPal site, you will be able to print out your details and email the form with a check to CWA. Once you have paid, your information will be updated in our database, and your website added to our Members' Gallery.

We will be using the new system for the upcoming John Muir show in February next year. You sign up online for the shows, upload and re-size your images. We also will be able to have slide shows of our accepted paintings and offer them for sales on our sales site, which today only has catalogs and aprons.

PROSPECTUS

MEMBERSHIP:

To apply for membership, send resume and jpegs or web site address to pvlara@sbcglobal.net and artcmom@yahoo.com OR send resume and photos of your work to Gallery Concord, 1765 Galindo St., Concord, CA 94520. Member selection is based on the quality of work and the needs of the gallery. All artists showing at the gallery on an on-going basis must be members of CWA with dues current. Artists will be accepted as vacancies occur.

SELECTION JURORS:

2-3 past CWA Presidents and the Gallery Directors of Gallery Concord

ARTIST DUTIES:

Member artists must make a six month commitment to Gallery Concord. Member artists will be required to sit approximately one day a month. Member artists must also volunteer for duties once a quarter at receiving, hanging, or the reception. Artists wishing to no longer be a member of the gallery must give 30 days notice prior to the end of a quarter.

GALLERY ENTRIES:

To allow equal representation, a point system, based on the painting sizes, is used to determine the number of entries per member artist for each show. No copies or class work allowed. Paintings must be completely framed in metal or wood, wired and ready to hang. No sawtooths, clamps or screw eyes. Flat brackets required on wood frames. Plexiglas is required on all paintings larger than 14" in any direction. Member artists may show only water based media on paper. Gallery Concord reserves the right to withhold the hanging of any painting. Framed artwork may be hung in the Gallery only once a year. Unframed pieces may be shown more than once in a year.

SHOWS:

Member artist shows are changed quarterly.

FEES:

Fees of \$25 per quarter are paid by member artists by cash or check made payable to Gallery Concord.

HOURS:

The gallery is open Thursday through Sunday 11:00 to 4:00.

RECEPTIONS:

A reception is held with the opening of each new show. Artists are expected to attend the receptions.

SALES:

15% of sales will go to CWA Scholarship/Outreach Program.

OTHER EVENTS:

The Gallery classroom can be used by gallery member artists for workshops, classes, and other events. Permission must be secured from a gallery director. There are no charges for the use of the gallery.
