



May Guest Artist Chris Beck



Chris Beck loves color and pattern and likes to mix strong design with amazing details for that special “wow” factor in her paintings. Although she spent many years on “serious” art, she has always had a fondness for the silly and the whimsical and has been incorporating visual jokes and puns in her paintings for several years now. She has been collecting quirky vintage salt shakers for more than ten years and those are the main focus of her most recent paintings. Known for her smooth washes, she is a strong proponent of masking fluid, which she uses to achieve her special effects.

Although Chris concentrated on watercolor during her college years as an art major, she put fine art aside for many years while she worked as a graphic designer. During a mysterious health crisis in 1995, she returned to painting, and specifically watercolor, for several reasons. “I love the tactile qualities of painting with watercolor” she says, “because it flows and is effortless to apply. I also love the clarity and brilliance of the paint, and the unusual properties of some pigments add extra interest to the outcomes. In addition, I have problems with chemical sensitivities, so watercolor -- having no dust or solvent fumes -- is a perfect medium for me.”

Since returning to painting, Chris has won numer-

ous awards for her watercolors. She was included in the prestigious 2012 Shanghai Zhujiajiao International Watercolour Biennial Exhibition, and she is a signature member of the National Watercolor Society, the Transparent Watercolor Society of America, and Watercolor West.

Her work has been selected for Splash 14 – Light and Color, North Light Books (Summer, 2013) and Splash 15 – Creative Solutions (Summer, 2014) and she was published in Splash 7 – A Celebration of Light (2002). Her award-winning work is also featured on the cover of Best of America Watermedia II by Kennedy Publishing (September 2010) as well as on the cover of The Mouse Project by Steve Worthington (October 2010).

Chris’s watercolors were the subject of a feature article -- “Playing in Earnest” -- in the September 2012 issue of The Artist’s Magazine, and she was featured in a ten-page article entitled “Adventures in the Ordinary” in Watercolor Artist magazine (August 2009). Her work was also featured on the title page of “Full-Spectrum Color” -- an article on four still-life artists working in different media -- in the May 2011 issue of The Artist’s Magazine. Her award-winning painting in the Watermedia Showcase Competition was published in Watercolor Artist magazine (February 2010) and The Artist’s Magazine featured her in the “Competition Spotlight” (June 2009) and as Artist of the Month on their website in January, 2008.

In December 2008, she created Brush-Paper-Water, a watercolor showcase blog featuring watercolorists working in a variety of styles and techniques; she curated and edited the site, posting 66 bi-weekly features between 2008 and mid-2011. The blog is now inactive but continues to serve as a resource for watercolorists.

Chris teaches workshops on color, design, and painting techniques for watercolorists.

IN THE BEGINNING...

IT WAS NOT WALT DISNEY'S SNOW WHITE

Water+color came from the streams and pigments of the earth. Experts claim that water+color was used for cave paintings of Paleolithic Europe. Manuscripts from the Egyptian times illuminated their writings with water medium. The German Northern Renaissance artist Albrecht Dürer (1472-1528) is credited with fine botanical, wildlife and landscape watercolors - a turning point in watercolor history.

On April 13-14, several CWA artists were invited to participate as working artists throughout the museum. Our entire membership was graciously recognized with a special discount and invitation to join the fun while learning about animation and Disney's first, full length feature film - Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs Special Exhibition - now closed for a new event.

"Of all the characters in the fairy tales, I loved Snow White the best, and when I planned my first full-length cartoon, she inevitably was the heroine." Walt Disney. If you missed this special weekend opportunity, please put this on your 'to do' list. You will be proud to say you are an artist who shares a little history in watercolor. And, you will have a chance to see the next Special Exhibition at WDFM.

In the beginning, animators from the original Disney team, were also watercolorists, especially the background artists who worked in a different manner than the character artists. Many of the Disney artists started their careers as members of the California Water Color Society. We are members of the California Watercolor Association. All of us are working artists in water+color and share the love for the art.

Please treat yourself to a visit back in time at the Walt Disney Family Museum. It will make you fondly recollect and chuckle about Mickey and all the Disney characters. You'll gain new appreciation for what artists brought to life through animation and the complexity of the task. Find out why and how the background artists worked separately from the rest of the animation team and how magically everything united into successful films. Did Albrecht Dürer influence the animators who used real rabbits as their models for Disney characters? I hope this information teases your interest, brings new inspiration to your artwork and leads a path to an enthusiastic wet brush. All of the above certainly influenced me.





MAY WORKSHOP: *Thomas Schaller*

"The Architecture of Light" May 10-12/All Levels WAIT LIST

Following a 20-year career in New York City as an architect and architectural artist, Thomas Schaller is now a full-time watercolor artist living in California. He has won many awards for his architectural artwork and has authored two books: "Architecture in Watercolor" and "The Art of Architectural Drawing." His artwork has been collected and exhibited around the world, featured in many magazines and publications, and included in a number of prestigious exhibitions. "Light" is the constant narrative in Thomas' work; hence, light as the key to working effectively with values in a composition, is the focus of his workshop. Thomas will demonstrate the fundamentals of identifying strong compositional subjects and how to bring strength and clarity to your compositions with a simple value organization. Students will be guided through Thomas' approach: Identifying subject matter by concentrating less on specific objects (places or things) and more on the strength of an abstract value composition of darks and lights, executing quick impressionistic initial abstract value sketches, and completing a strong and satisfying watercolor. "Seeing & Painting the Layers of a Subject" July 15-19/All Levels

Ric Dentinger, who began his career as a professional illustrator and art director, is a contemporary realist who paints traditional subjects with a passion for watercolor that is reflected in his bold and confident approach. The signature of a Dentinger watercolor is his use of intense color, dramatic highlights, and bold expression. Ric has received many national awards and his work has been widely exhibited and featured in numerous publications. Ric will teach his approach to seeing through the layers of a subject, along with unique methods of applying paint, and different perspectives on design and composition. He will also demonstrate his approach of working from the darks to the lights, his use of jewel-like color, his texturing techniques, and the use of gouache for certain effects. Jean Pederson has been painting for over twenty years, balancing her strong teaching abilities and writing with her continuing aspiration to convey her ideas in visual form. She has exhibited her work in China, England, Sweden, New York, San Francisco, Mexico and across Canada, and is the author of "Expressive Portraits: Creative Methods for Painting People;" North Light Books has approved her to write a second book and she has been honored with numerous national and international awards. Jean's workshop will open the door into the exploration of various combinations of mixed media with an emphasis on water soluble paints and mediums as they relate to the human face and figure. We will be exploring how everything from watercolor to gouache, gesso, acrylics, inks, mark making tools, collage and much more can be applied to figure painting. "Chinese Brush & Watercolor Painting" October 14-18/All Levels

Lian Zhen obtained a BA from the University of California and a Master of Architecture Degree from MIT after immigrating to the US from China. He has exhibited in the US, Hong Kong and China, and his paintings hang in numerous institutional and private collections, including the MIT Museum. An experienced instructor, Lian has taught watercolor and Chinese brush painting throughout the US, as well as in Europe, Canada, Mexico, the Bahamas, China, South Africa and Australia. He has also juried a number of exhibitions and his paintings have been featured in many magazines and books. His three books on Chinese painting techniques have been distributed internationally. Lian's workshop will include one day of Chinese brush painting, followed by four days of watercolor. On the Chinese painting day, students will learn about Asian Art theory, how to use Chinese brushes, ink and colors, and painting techniques for spontaneous-style Chinese paintings. (Note that Chinese painting supplies will be available at the workshop for a modest fee.) During the watercolor session, Lian will teach techniques including his "Color Pouring and Blending," as well as composition and coloring. CWA member \$495, non-CWA \$550. Concord High

Charlotte Huntley gave a watercolor painting demonstration at Concord High school on March 1 and twenty one senior art students in Mr. Warren Dean's Watercolor class enjoyed this CWA Outreach instruction. The artist started her demo with a discussion of the endless possibilities in using watercolor medium. Students had an opportunity to look at a book, Xtraordinary by C. Huntley and J. Betts, then they learned how to create a body of art by observing the series of Charlotte's paintings with Hats. Students were excited to see how watercolor paintings were presented in a printed format, yet the process of creating an original work of art was just minutes away. Charlotte chose a lovely landscape with a red bridge as the subject matter. The drawing was completed and the photograph served as the reference material. Step by step, Charlotte showed her skills, including her unique semi-realistic technique, and her passion for watercolor. Starting with the main subject, she continued working from light to dark. While painting Charlotte explained how colors mix together, how layering technique can help when making a cool color glow with warmth. Nobody noticed when the time was up; during this demonstration, students eyes were glued to the evolving painting amazed how the blank paper started "coming to life" revealing the sunny landscape in just an hour and half of the lesson.
