"He who follows, is always behind." Plesanne

If you read my monthly newsletter articles, you know I am always searching for inspirational, art related, quotes. Why? To be inspired of course! I look for words that hold meaning for me, and then I share them with you, hoping to inspire you to find... inspiration! I'm always questioning myself, aren't you? What should I paint? What colors should I use? How should I paint what I have chosen to paint?

Then you start searching old magazines, old workshop notes, old YouTube videos, old DVDs... you are starting to get the pattern here... old is the key word. As reference material, this is all great. We just want to make sure that we grow not just follow.

Yes, we learn from masters, but must we "follow" them? I say... I shout, NO! I'm not saying, "don't take classes or workshops." I'm also not saying "don't watch videos or look at other people's blogs." I'm not advising folks to "stop reading art books and magazines." What I am saying is be inspired and curious about other artistic styles, then grab it and recreate it for you, by you.

Think about Monet. When he took his family to live in England during the Franco-Prussian war, he saw Turner's works (as a side note, in later years he denied it but his signature was found in the guest book during that period of time). Consider Van Gogh. His palette was dark and gloomy until he saw works by the Impressionists. We all know what direction Vincent's painting went after that. Cezanne after painting with Pissarro, changed his style forever. Last but not least, Picasso viewing Cezanne's work. Picasso developed cubism from Cezanne's style and never looked back.

So, as we move into our 50th National Exhibition season I say to you...

Lead your own art and let others follow you!




Oakland VA – Maori Symbols and their Meanings

Images of the butterfly, tree and snake have different symbolic meaning for western and eastern cultures. Last month the Oakland CWA team and vets were treated to painting and learning about symbols from the Maori culture. The Maori are the indigenous people of Australia. Each year the Maori in spring, or on a significant day, make a drawing exercise which they then interpret as a guide for their coming year. We were instructed to paint a circle on our paper, and then add, in any order we chose, the following items: tree, mountain, path, bird, shelter, flower, snake and butterfly. No additional instructions were offered.

When we had all the symbols on the paper, we divided the circle into four equal parts. These were the domains of our mental, emotional, physical and spiritual states. Then we noted how many of the items were included in each section





and what each item symbolized for the Maori. For example, the path symbolizes the ability to hope, our direction and is our discipline. The snake symbolizes transformation, regeneration and renewal. The mountain is our spiritual center, our trust and personal identity.

One vet has a great fear of snakes, even to the point of being uncomfortable painting a snake. She did manage a squiggly line and confessed that her fear of snakes just showed how far she was from the Maori interpretation of regeneration and transformation. Everyone enjoyed learning about Maori culture and creating our personal guide. The trick is in the interpretation and that is our personal project.

CWA Announces 2020 Scholarship for the Arts Program

Scholarship Awards/Benefits/Criteria

The California Watercolor Association (CWA) will award a \$1,000 scholarship for a college art major. This scholarship is designed to help students starting a college education in art with an emphasis in watercolor media. The award will be given upon documentation of enrollment in a college.

The scholarship will be presented May 20, 2020, at the regular CWA May General Meeting with his/her art featured on display during the meeting.

This award will be determined based on artistic ability in the medium of watercolor, service to the art community, and academic achievement in art classes.

Applicants are asked to submit an artist's statement, digital art portfolio, letters of recommendation and relevant documentation. Deadline for submission is March 1, 2020. We understand that acceptance letters from colleges may not have been received by this date.

Applicants will be notified by March 23, 2020. The scholarship winner will be asked to deliver matted or framed artwork to be displayed at the May CWA General Meeting by May 20, 2020 (location to be determined).







Venue

The Harrington Gallery, in the Firehouse Arts Center, 4444 Railroad Avenue, Pleasanton, California, features the works of renowned visual artists of regional and national stature in painting, sculpture, installations, and conceptual art. Old Fire Station Number One, established in 1888, served downtown Pleasanton well for many years. This rebuilt facility became the basis for the Firehouse Arts Center, including a portion of the original building with brick walls preserved within the gallery space. The gallery is just a few steps off Main Street in the heart of downtown Pleasanton.

Eligibility

- CWA 50th National Exhibition is open to all artists 18 years or older.
- Paintings must be two-dimensional and primarily of watermedia on paper surface; Yupo and Tyvek are acceptable.
- Pastel or collage may be used as long as watermedia is the dominant element.
- No digital media, photography, prints, or reproductions. Source material and composition must be wholly original and not derived from any published images.
- Any photo reference material must be taken by the artist and is neither copyrighted nor published.
- Entries must be recent works completed within the last two years, entirely the work of the artist, and not shown previously in a CWA National Exhibition.

NEXT

- All paintings must be for sale. The selling price cannot be changed after entry.
- No workshop or class work allowed.
- Artists who fail to provide an accepted entry are disqualified from the next two CWA National Exhibitions.

Size Limits

- Minimum image: 140 square inches, no side less than 10 inches.
- Maximum outside frame: 44x44 square inches.

How to Submit an Entry

All entries will be submitted through our website, www.californiawatercolor.org.

CWA Members

Log in to the Members Home Page; choose the National Exhibition link; confirm your information; add your painting details, and upload your images.

Members Entry Fee (nonrefundable): \$40 for one image, \$5 each additional image, maximum three. Entry fees are payable on PayPal by credit, debit or individual account.

Non-CWA Members

From our Home Page, click on 50th National – How to Enter, or go to Shows/Exhibitions, National Exhibitions, National Exhibition Entry – Non-CWA Members and follow the instructions.

Non-members Entry Fee (nonrefundable): \$50 for one image, \$5 each additional image, maximum three. Entry fees are payable on PayPal by credit, debit or individual account.

You will need the following information to complete your entry:

- Title of painting
- Size of frame and size of painting image (height x width)
- Selling price (The selling price cannot be changed after entry.)
- Medium
- Digital jpg image of your painting, 300 dpi, no more than 1200 pixels on the longest side. Show only the image without mat or frame.

You may wish to join CWA prior to entry to save on your entry fee and to enjoy the benefits of membership. You may do this during the entry process.

▶ Deadline for submission is midnight, September 1, 2019 - Pacific Standard Time

Framing

- All paintings must be framed in simple, square-cornered frames ready for hanging.
- Paintings must be protected under sturdy acrylic, such as Plexiglas. No glass is permitted.
- Mats (optional) must be white or off white. Colored liner mats are acceptable.
- Additional details will be included in instructions to accepted artists.
- Artists outside of the contiguous USA may send artwork unframed, and CWA will frame for the exhibition for an additional \$100 fee.

Accepted Entries

All accepted artists will be notified by email, and the selected artists will be posted online September 28, 2019. Artists with accepted artwork may be asked for a higher resolution image for the exhibition catalog. Shipping instructions will be attached to the acceptance email. All accepted paintings will have a handling fee of \$50. Accepted work must match submitted image; paintings not consistent with submitted image may be disqualified. All accepted paintings will be represented in the exhibition catalog. Each exhibition entrant will receive a complimentary catalog prior to the exhibition opening. Additional catalogs will be available for purchase.

Sales

The Harrington Gallery will handle all painting sales and retain a 30% commission.

Conditions and Liabilities

No work may be withdrawn before the end of the exhibit. CWA and the Harrington Gallery reserve the right to photograph artwork or copy images for promotional purposes. Insurance coverage is the artist's sole responsibility, both in transit and during the exhibit. Neither CWA nor the Harrington Gallery insures the artwork and neither shall be responsible for loss or damage to any artwork submitted. Accepted artists must sign a release of liability. The submission of entries to this competition shall constitute an agreement on the part of the artist to the terms and conditions as set forth in this prospectus.

Plein Air - Crab Cove, Alameda

Saturday, July 20, 2019, 10:00am to 1:30pm



We can meet at 10 am at the end of McKay Avenue near the beach and then spread out and paint. There are picnic tables near there in the grassy area where we can meet again at 1:30pm to share what we've done. Bring a bag lunch.

From Cities to the North:

Take I-80 West to I-880 South and take the Broadway exit. Turn right at the light onto 5th Street. Stay on 5th Street following the signs to Alameda. Go through the Webster Street Tunnel (Tube) to Alameda. See in Alameda below.

From Cities to the South:

Take I-880 North. Exit at Broadway in Oakland. Turn right on Broadway, right on 7th Street, and right on Webster. Go through the Webster Street Tunnel (Tube) to Alameda. *See in Alameda below.*

From Walnut Creek:

Take Highway 24 West to I-980, towards downtown Oakland. Exit at 12th/11th Streets. Continue on Brush Street to 5th Street. Turn left on 5th Street and stay in the left lanes, following the signs to Alameda. Go through the Webster Street Tunnel (Tube) to Alameda. See in Alameda below.

In Alameda:




