

Roland Lee has become nationally known for his transparent watercolors of the southwest landscape, the pioneer west, and rural European scenes. A signature member of the National Watercolor Society, he devotes full time to painting from his studio in the historic district of St. George, Utah.

Since 1979 Roland has concentrated on the medium of transparent watercolor using no white, black, or opaque paints. A graduate of Brigham Young University, he has exhibited and won awards in more than 100 invitational juried shows including the National Watercolor Society, the Transparent Watercolor Society of America, the Utah Watercolor Society, and Arts for the Parks Top 100. In 2014 he was awarded the Governor's Mansion Medal from Utah Governor Gary Herbert for his contributions to the Arts in Utah.

Roland has been painting transparent watercolors for 40 years. He has written painting articles for PleinAir magazine, the Artist's Magazine, Drawing Board magazine, been featured in Southwest Art, Art West magazine, Western Art Collector, and in several books including Splash 11 from Northlight Books. He has taught workshops throughout America and taught art classes at Dixie State University. He has also produced 10 watercolor instructional DVDs.






Youth Awards: Alameda County Fair Virtual Exhibit

Hello fellow CWA members,

Yes, it's that time again. I never get tired of asking you to volunteer to be a board member!

We are asking you to step up and become a member of the CWA board. What is new this year is that we are running our meetings on ZOOM!

It is not nearly as fun as meeting in person, however it is easier than driving to a meeting when it's dark, raining or a high traffic time. Please keep this in mind when considering joining the board.

Positions open right now:

Vice President/Membership (position can be shared) **Communications Director** (position can be shared) Member At Large (Two positions open)

Position open 2021:

President (position can be shared)

Yes, it is time for me to retire. After three years as Program Director and six years as President it is time to step down and welcome others to the position. I will be working on various items for the board but I will not be on the board. I will assist in any way I can for 2021.

Here are brief descriptions of the positions:

Vice President/Membership: The Vice President shall manage the membership processes of recruitment, record membership, new member orientation, and shall oversee management of petition(s) for signature membership(s). The Vice President shall be responsible for duties or special projects as may be prescribed by the President and/or CWA Board of Directors. In the absence or disability of the President, the Vice President shall perform all duties of the President; shall have signature powers over the financial accounts along with the Budget Director, which shall have the same validity and binding effect as if done by the President. The Vice President shall act as Board Liaison to the Data Manager.

Communications Director: The Communications Director shall work with the board to publicize CWA and its activities, including contacting other arts groups and news organizations as requested by a board member or appointed Committee Chair. The Communications Director shall manage the publishing of the Newsletter and the actions of the webmaster. The Communications Director shall be the designated board member to receive all inquiries sent to the email address noted at the start of the Policies and Procedures document and to then pass said inquiries to the proper Board, committee, or staff person.

Members At Large: The two members at-large will have no assigned programs. They will provide assistance to the Board on special assignments, will learn the Boards' functions, and will serve as liaison between the Board and the general membership.

President: The President shall supervise the Association's activities and put into effect the decisions of the Board. The President shall preside, at meetings of the Association both general and Board; appoint chairman and members of all Committees except where otherwise stated; sign all written contracts or obligations of the Association subject to Board approval; shall function as ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee; make a report at the November general meeting of the progress of the Association during the past year with recommendations for the coming year; shall appoint a qualified person to review the annual accounting processes once per year; shall have signature authority over the financial accounts along with the Budget Director; shall be responsible for seeing that the Bylaws and Policies of the Association are carried out; and, may have such other powers and duties as the Bylaws may direct; shall carry out the duties of the office in such a way as to promote the effective operation of the Association.


6) Members who return videos after 30 days must pay a \$5.00 Late Fee. Lost videos must be replaced at the video replacement value.

Take I-80 West to I-880 South and take the Broadway exit. Turn right at the light onto 5th Street. Stay on 5th Street following the signs to Alameda. Go through the Webster Street Tunnel (Tube) to Alameda. *See in Alameda below.*

From Cities to the South:

Take I-880 North. Exit at Broadway in Oakland. Turn right on Broadway, right on 7th Street, and right on Webster. Go through the Webster Street Tunnel (Tube) to Alameda. *See in Alameda below.*

From Walnut Creek:

Take Highway 24 West to I-980, towards downtown Oakland. Exit at 12th/11th Streets. Continue on Brush Street to 5th Street. Turn left on 5th Street and stay in the left lanes, following the signs to Alameda. Go through the Webster Street Tunnel (Tube) to Alameda. *See in Alameda below.*
