The Drawing Board

Each month a different member of the CWA Board of Directors has the opportunity to write an art-related article for our members.

In Defense of the Ugly Painting

Have you ever created an ugly painting? If your answer is no, you should quit reading and go on to a different part of this newsletter. If your answer is yes, read on.

I've been painting for many years now, and have done a good bit of instructing beginning painters. What I've found is that pretty much all paintings go through an ugly phase. We picture a beautiful outcome but get bogged down between start and finish when things get ugly. When I instruct beginners, I find that a lot of what I do is encourage them to continue through the ugly stages of the painting. It helps to understand the process and to know that it will not be equally pretty all the way through its creation.

Here are some ideas that help in this process. One is simply to persevere. It is too easy to walk away from a half-finished painting, so I have tried to develop the habit of finishing whatever I start.

Another, is to just step away. Give yourself some distance from a painting by standing across the room, or letting it rest for a day. Often we are just too close to the painting to get the full impact of our efforts.

Sometimes, finishing touches magically transform a ho-hum painting, or even an ugly one, into something beautiful. Then again, sometimes the painting is not transformed, and you just end up with an ugly painting. Then it is time to change your mindset from one of expecting a certain outcome to one of learning from the process. Even a bad painting helps us sharpen our observation skills and gives us a sense of accomplishment. Then you need to ask yourself some questions:

What bothers me about the painting?

Was there something, anything, I liked about it? Can I try out my Mr. Clean magic eraser to make adjustments? Can I glaze over something to change the emphasis?

What was compelling about the scene that caused me to want to paint it? Is the subject too complex for my skill level? Can I simplify it? Can I crop it?

Is it worth trying again in a new painting?

Sometimes I've painted something over and discovered that I've created another ugly painting. This is usually because rather than analyzing my mistakes, I've gone back and done the same thing again. Why would I expect a different result the second time, if my muscle memory takes over and I just do it the same way? Sometimes, our skill level doesn't match the project, and we have to learn some new skills and try again later.

When I have made the effort to analyze my mistakes and do the next painting differently, sometimes I've created an excellent painting the second time. I remember painting from a Biblical concept for an annual art show put on by my church. Painting a Biblical concept is not easy as there is no reference photo from which to take clues. The first painting I did was awful! I realized that I liked some elements of the design but not the colors. I started over and the second try was more successful.

In fact, at the end of the exhibition, an oil painter whom I greatly admired bought the painting and now displays it in her home.



The painting shown above, of historic Trevarno Road in Livermore in the fall, is one that I'm happy with.

It took me two earlier efforts and two years before I felt I had succeeded.

If all else fails, the back of a failed painting makes a great spot to practice and try out techniques and color mixes. I always try to keep some practice paper handy to try out colors and techniques before I put them into the painting I am working on.

In summary, ugly paintings give us a safe place to fail. It is not, after all, brain surgery. They allow us to express something inside us which needs to get out. And a reason to try again tomorrow.

Community Outreach On the Pier at Dusk: Sharing Stories and Expressions



Dusk casts a captivating ambiance, as the vibrant colors of the day mellow into subdued tones, transforming backlit scenes into enchanting silhouettes. Such was our project with the Oakland Veterans Center. Led by Michael Friedland, our skilled instructor, we delved into the art of creating gradated washes and sketched the horizon line and pier, carefully considering the interplay of five distinct values. Our canvas included the silhouettes of people gracing the pier and birds soaring overhead, presenting us with a gratifying challenge.

We employed a combination of cerulean blue and an ultramarine, blending them with warm red to produce both a cool and warm dark. These nuanced shades would eventually bring to life the figures on the pier, their reflections shimmering on the water's surface. Michael emphasized that our composition adhered to the timeless principle of figure/ground dynamics. The sky and clouds were a subtle range of blues and grays, breaking into a glow on the horizon, then a strip of land just slightly darker. To ensure optimal results, Michael guided us through the process, drying the paper between stages.

For many in the group, painting figures was a relatively new experience. While some of us followed the prescribed

format, others infused their artwork with personal narratives and unique perspectives. As we shared our paintings and spoke about our artistic journeys, poignant personal stories emerged. For the veterans among us, this painting class meant more than just a creative pursuit; it served as a therapeutic outlet for processing our emotions. Our collective efforts culminated in a series of accomplished paintings and when we each spoke about our paintings a few personal stories came out.

By coming together through the medium of art, we not only honed our creative skills but also formed meaningful bonds that transcended the strokes of a brush. The Oakland Veterans Center's community outreach program continues to provide a space where expression and camaraderie thrive, offering a sanctuary where stories are shared, and hearts are brought closer together.
