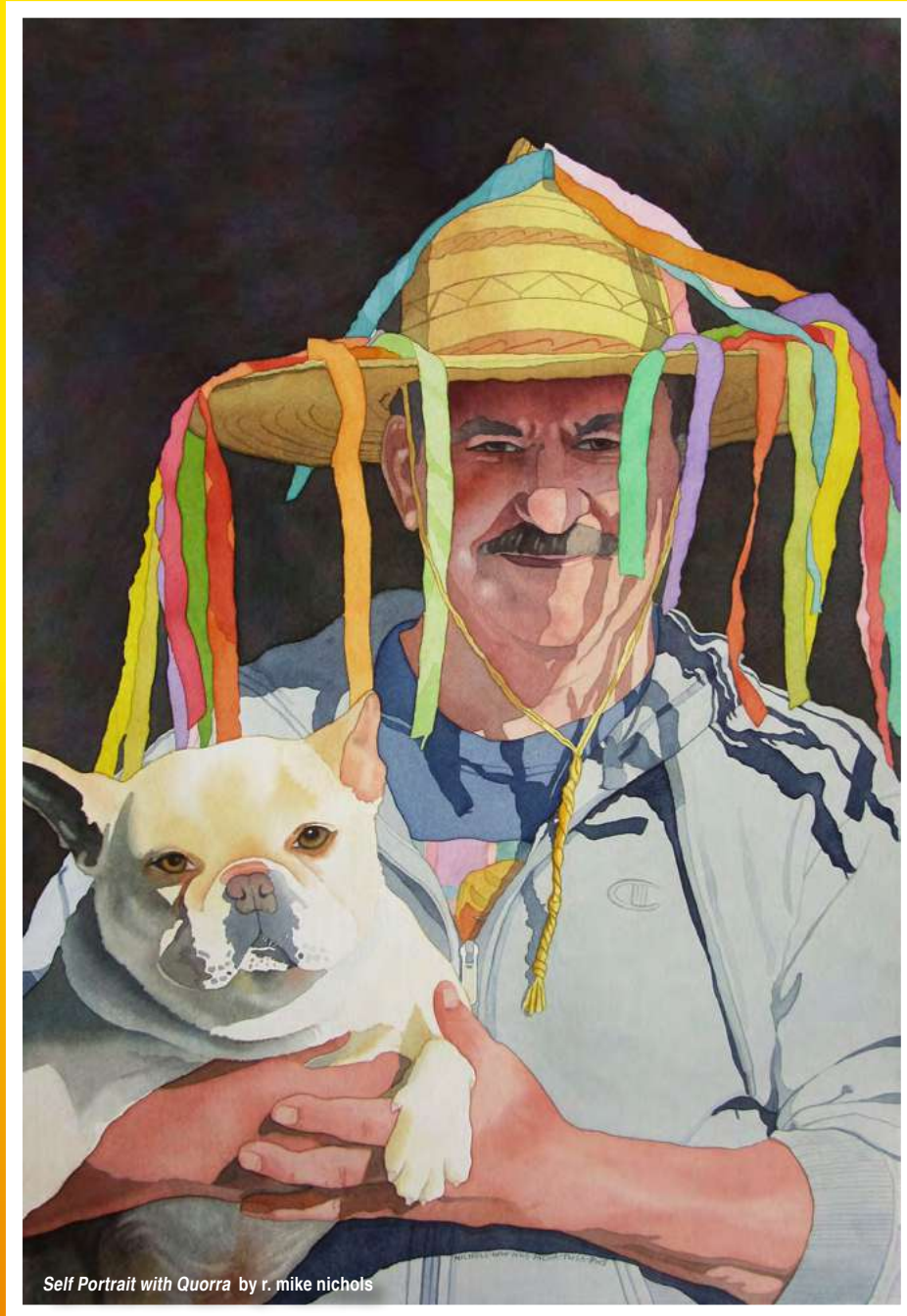

Community Outreach

A Gift of Art Goes from Pinole Valley High School Students to Nigerian Students



Pinole Valley High School students have created 48 fabulous portraits of Nigerian students via sponsorship by CWA and the Memory Project. The Pinole Valley students were sent photos and a few words describing the Nigerians from which they created the gifts of portraits.

Things aren't easy in Nigeria and one Nigerian student, Samya Moody, wrote...

"Sometimes home is a person, and you may be that person to the ones you hold close."

This may apply to us all.

The students used scratchboard to make these portraits. Scratchboard is a technique in which is paper covered in acrylic paint. Then a tool like a stylus is used to scratch away the black coating. They created their own tools out of thumbtacks (different tools create different marks). To achieve grays, the students used hatch marks.

These portraits are so stunning that I'm sure the students will keep them as a memory of themselves in their teenage years. Once these portraits have been presented to the Nigerian students their responses will be recorded and we will feature their responses in a later newsletter.

We congratulate the students at Pinole Valley High School for their generous and creative work and Mars Tremor, their art teacher, for her great guidance.

Nancy Redden, the long-term leader, suggested the project for February—people in transition. She had two prototypes that the group could work from or they could bring their own concepts to the project.

Michael Friedland provided guidance and expertise as we painted. We all started with a loose colorful landscape background. When that was dry, the silhouette, figure, or figure and doorway were added. The group went silent in deep concentration conceiving and then painting to the last minute.

Finally, Libby Erickson, a volunteer, displayed all our work and each of us spoke about what we had painted. Each person painted a distinctive image and, though there were some wishes for better outcomes, the consensus was that much was achieved. We had some provocative works. “Bravo for us!”



Campolinda High School Students Send Portraits of Ukrainian Students



Earlier this year Community Outreach Co-Director, Georganne Zaro-Eddy, connected the Campolinda High School teacher, Justin Seligman, and his students to the Memory Project. They created Portraits of Ukrainian children in Poland. A video was created of the Ukrainian students and their parents looking at the artwork and messages of their responses.

In Memoriam



VICTORIA CHIOFALO

JUNE 24, 1936 – FEBRUARY 9, 2023

A wonderful extended life dedicated to love for her family and for art. She was born in Bombay, India, and was raised in Shanghai, China during the Japanese occupation. In 1948, at the age of 12, she moved to Argentina with her father and sister. While there, as a teenager she became a movie actress and was featured in several movies (Film Andes, El Mal Amor, Surcos en el Mar). In 1959 Victoria married Roberto Chiofalo, a musical director, and had four children. In 1963 the family moved from Argentina to San Francisco, California.

Victoria loved art all her life, it was her passion. She studied painting in Argentina and continued her art studies in college, in the United States.

She loved people and flowers. She cultivated roses and painted them; she used to say, "I do not paint roses, I make portraits of roses and people." She worked in oils, pastels, watercolors, acrylics, charcoal, and stained glass based on her own designs of floral and portraits.

Her paintings were successfully displayed in many juried exhibitions, including Bruener's Fine Arts Gallery in Santa Rosa, Menlo Park Civic Center, John Muir Hospital in Walnut Creek, Santa Cruz Art League, Newark, and Marin County Civic Centers, Kaiser Foundation in Oakland, Gallery on the Avenue in Burlingame and the San Francisco Hall of Flowers. Victoria also had solo exhibits at the Palo Alto Medical Foundation, The Garden Café, and Peninsula Hospital in Burlingame. She obtained many awards, among them a First Place in the Rosicrucian Egyptian Museum Exhibit in 1986, with her painting "Lily Pads."

Her professional affiliations included the National League of American Pen Women, Inc., where she was President of the Nob Hill Branch in 2000/01. She was also a member at large of the Society of Western Artists, where she acted as Exhibit Director for several years. Other affiliations included the California Watercolor Association, where she received her signature award in 2003. Victoria was curator for the U.C.S.F. Student, Faculty and Staff art shows in the past and in 1996 won the "People's Choice" award for her "Pas des Deux."

Last November, Victoria, and Roberto celebrated their 63rd wedding anniversary. Victoria is pre-deceased by her daughter Laura and survived by her husband Roberto, daughters Cristina and Claudia and son Robert, her sister Helen, six grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.
