

David is an Alameda, California, artist who likes to pack up his watercolor supplies in a few baskets attached to his electric bike, hop on the battery-powered two-wheeler, and ride to the bay to catch a ferry into San Francisco. Once there, he cruises up and down the city streets, searching for compelling compositions to paint en plein air."What's going on in the atmosphere? What are the people doing?" he asks himself before settling on a scene to paint. "I've always enjoyed cityscapes because people, places, and a moment in time capture my interest," he explains. "It's like you're being a storyteller about that moment in time." "The outdoors is my studio," he concedes.

David recently won Best Watercolor in PleinAir Salon's December/January competition for his painting, *Clay Street—Chinatown*. It's a quintessential Savellano work, capturing not only an iconic section of San Francisco but also the dramatic light-and-shadow effects he seeks out and the loose, spontaneous brushwork he enjoys dashing off on his paper when working en plein air. "I like the immediacy of being able to paint something right then and there," he says. "Most of my paintings are done on-site, in one shot. I don't take paintings back into the studio to fix them up."



The Drawing Board

Each month a different member of the CWA Board of Directors has the opportunity to write an art-related article for our members.

John Singer Sargent by Lis MacDonald

I wanted to explore John Singer Sargent's prolific and amazing watercolors, and I queried why he is still admired by current watercolor artists almost a hundred years after his death. He painted about 900 oils and over 2000 watercolors during his lifetime. His oil paintings provided him with a steady income from commissions, but watercolors allowed him more spontaneity and artistic freedom as they were easy to transport, dried quickly and were ideal for his love of plein-air painting.

John Singer Sargent was born in Florence, Italy in 1856 to American parents, his father a physician, and an artistic mother, who encouraged her children to draw and paint, expecting them to complete a drawing or painting daily. Home-schooled as his family roamed around Europe, he showed promise early as a burgeoning artist and was given watercolor lessons from a German artist at the age of 13. He trained at the École Nationale Supérieure des Beaux-Arts in Paris where he honed his skill as a portrait painter and was commissioned for many portraits both in Europe in the U.S. At the turn of the century, he tired of doing portraits claiming it difficult to keep an ongoing conversation with his subject while painting. Preferring plein air painting he resumed painting landscapes in the many places he visited and lived. Many of his watercolors were painted without a drawing underneath, as John had an amazing ability to draw with his brush.

His method of painting watercolors was considered unconventional for the time as his watercolors were often painted wet-into-wet on rough paper and in an impressionistic style. The rough paper was thick white woven with a granular surface with sufficient sizing to allow for frequent rewetting and manipulation of the surface. The paper came in blocks of sizes, 12 x 14 and as big as 16 x 21 inches.

Paints were available in "cakes" made of color and gum Arabic and later manufacturers added honey and/or glycerin to make them softer and easier to use and were packed in tubes. Sargent used both tube and pan paints. He even applied impasto paint to his watercolors.

Although uncertain, examination of Sargent's watercolors, suggests that he may have used modifiers like gelling agents such as watercolor megilp. Gum Arabic imparted a shine, and glycerin slowed drying and increased granulation. An unusual method at the time, he used colorless wax to the paper to impart sparkle to his paintings.

His tools for watercolor painting included pointed sable hair brushes of varying sizes, including flats and mops. He also used sponges to apply paint and often used a fine-point brush with water to lift and blot color away. For more complete removal of paint, he used a stiffer brush. Scrapers, knives, or blunt ends of a brush were also used, and any device he could find to achieve the effect he wanted.

COMPARENT COMPANY OUTREACH Recent activities at the VA Martinez included painting skies




Without a photo to copy, skies can be challenging because they rely on memory and imagination. Even a plein air sky tends to change.

is available online. He chose to sketch but assisted others in their painting process. He did some sketches and gave a lesson on basic sketching techniques that were well received.




Michael Reardon Watercolor Techniques 3-Day In-Person Workshop | September 27-29, 2024 All Skill Levels



In many ways David is a storyteller, a chronicler of the times, and the best way to tell his modern-day tales is to be in the open air. "When you paint outdoors, you're completely immersed in the scene, the atmosphere, and the mood," he says. "When I look at one of my paintings, I feel the energy of that place or scene like I was there yesterday. Ultimately, that's the feeling I'm trying to induce in others who see my work."


