

Each month a different member of the CWA Board of Directors has the opportunity to write an art-related article for our members.

Value Studies, Notans and Chiaroscuro by Lis MacDonald

Value—the range of light to dark—is one of the most important elements in creating visually compelling artwork.

A value study focuses on the full range of values (light-mid-dark) to guide the composition and darkness within an image. By removing color, the artist evaluates the composition using only grayscale values, ensuring clear separation between light and shadow. Watercolor artists commonly begin with a value study to establish composition and determine the focal point. Artists such as Andy Evansen and Gary Tucker rely on this process for every painting.

The value study— not the reference photo—guides the artwork, allowing the artist to choose any color palette while maintaining accurate value relationships. The value study, although it seems like extra work, is essential for creating an effective painting. Areas of greatest impact are when the darkest value surrounds the lightest light. Watercolorists must plan for the lights as they paint from light to dark whereas oil and acrylic painters can paint light over dark.

Having stressed the importance of darks and lights, most of the painting (80%) should predominantly be a range of mid-values. These areas unify the painting design and the remaining 20% is where the focal area and visual interest reside.

Creating a value study also allows the artist to alter the image design for a better composition by either adding or omitting forms or shapes from the original image.

Keep in mind that watercolors always dry lighter (up to 30%) and may need additional layers of darker colors to achieve the desired value.

However, one can paint a high key painting containing only light and mid-tone values.

Conversely, a low-key painting, such as a nocturne will contain primarily dark values and very few light or mid-values.





Experimenting with Edge and Flat Stamping à la Bud Shackleford





This month's gathering was a blast! Instead of just paint brushes, we made marks using sponges, edges of 300 lb. watercolor paper, corrugated cardboard, a credit card, bubble wrap, and any manner of items that many would consider rubbish. We brushed thick paint onto a tool, then pressed it onto the paper.

To begin everyone worked on a test sheet. Seeing what shapes and effects we could achieve and liked. The edge marks were very clear and decisive, but could be blurred by stamping onto wet paper and shifting or scraping with the tool. Then we transitioned to a quarter-sheet watercolor paper and drew the composition we wanted from the source featuring cactus, a hacienda and mountains. With that agreed upon, we all relaxed.

It was a very engaging process and hard to stop playing around. Just one participant almost finished her piece. She knew that she wouldn't be at the next session. She did an original twist to the subject matter. The cactus became pine trees and the hacienda became a Japanese temple. It had a whole different feel. We all enjoyed this session and the new possibilities it opened up to us. I don't think that we'll be abandoning our brushes anytime soon, but the combination is intriguing. We left the group feeling lighthearted.

Signature Membership Status — How to Apply

To apply for Signature Membership, an associate member must submit a petition to the Board through the Membership Director via the **Contact Us** page. This petition should include a letter detailing participation in CWA activities and must be accompanied by copies of the "Service Hours Record," along with show flyers or acceptance notices if necessary. The applicant is responsible for providing documentation, and acceptance is subject to Board approval.

Signature Membership (CWA)

To qualify for Signature Membership, an applicant must fulfill the following requirements:

- Be a member in good standing.
- Have acceptance into three CWA National/International Exhibitions; OR
- Have acceptance into two CWA National/International Exhibitions and completed a minimum of 60 volunteer hours.

For each service performed, a "Service Hours Record" should be filled out by the volunteer and signed by the individual overseeing the activity. This record documents the service provided.

- 60 Hours Per Year of Service: Board Members, Webmaster
- 30 Hours Per Year of Service: Hospitality Chair, Video Chair
- 10 Hours Per Year of Service: Show Chair

Master Signature Membership (MCWA)

To qualify for Master Signature Membership, an applicant must fulfill the following requirements:

- Achieve acceptance in three CWA National/International Exhibitions after acquiring initial Signature Membership.
- Petition the Membership Director using the **Contact Us** page, selecting "Membership Director" from the drop-down menu, and providing proof of acceptances in the form of show flyers, acceptance notices, or show catalog pages.

Signature members may use the initials "CWA" or "MCWA" after their signature on water-based media work if they desire. However, no member may use these initials until their petition has been granted by the Board. The use of these initials is contingent on continued membership with CWA.







March Demo Recap — Ken Goldman by Lis MacDonald

Ken Goldman outlined his art background with a slide show of paintings and sketches of birds that he had done over the years including murals for the San Diego Zoo and books he had authored and illustrated. He showed the anatomy of herons and egrets, demonstrating his method of drawing and painting. He likes to use the Cretacolor Nero black pencil and the Itoya double-headed calligraphy pens for drawing and painting. The Itoya pens are initially water soluble and come in several colors. He used 140-pound Arches paper and his Quiller palette is filled with paints from multiple vendors; he cannot recall each color as most were given to him as prizes. Notans and chiaroscuro are variations of value studies, but are used less frequently than the better-known value studies.

Notan is different from a value study (from the Japanese meaning light and dark) is like the yin and yang of a painting and has only two values. It is a high contrast value study of just light and dark and meant to define shapes and patterns rather than just the values. The shadows in an image are dark, and light areas are left white and the resulting image is then evaluated for its design.



Chiaroscuro, from the Italian (chiaro = light, scuro = dark), is the dramatic light and dark created from a single light source, first used by the Renaissance painting masters. It focuses a dramatic and emotional light on the figure (focal point) and surrounding it with deeper values.

Creating value studies has helped me become a better artist over time. I avoid painting just what I see and always do a value study before sketching onto my watercolor paper, and I encourage you to do the same.


