In 2024 he was named the recipient of the Arthur Ross Award in Fine Arts by the Institute of Classical Art and Architecture, winner of a 2024 Raphael Award, winner of the Ogden Pleissner Award by both the American Watercolor Society and the Salmagundi Art Club, and First Place Award winner in Watercolour International.

A two-time winner of the prestigious Hugh Ferriss Memorial Prize, he is also the author of three books, including the AIA award-winning *Architecture in Watercolor*. His latest, *Architect of Light*, published by Penguin. His new book, *The Creative Eye*, will be released in 2026. His best-selling DVD, *The Power of Design* is published by Streamline Media. And his interactive online mentorship program, “Design and the Power of Imagination,” is hosted by Terracotta LLC. Tom is a Signature Member of many arts groups around the world and is represented by Gallery 71, in New York City.

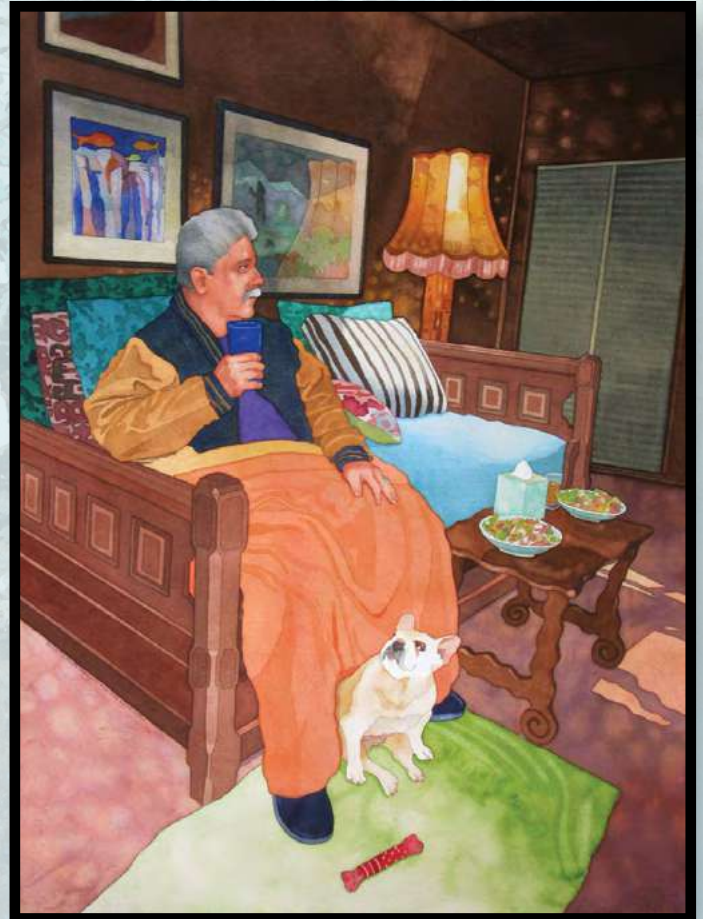

The Drawing Board

Each month a different member of the CWA Board of Directors has the opportunity to write an art-related article for our members.

Painting...Just for Fun by Georganne Zaro, MCWA

Sometimes it's refreshing to let go and paint something completely different from your usual style. Loosen up. Try something crazy. Be nonjudgmental with yourself. Choose a subject with no intention of showing it to anyone—let alone entering it in an art show. No pretensions. That's exactly what happened when I created *What Are Yaw Looking At* (top right).

Many years ago, while visiting a rural winery near Lodi, California, I noticed a large bush beside an old barn. To my amazement, four enormous roosters were perched inside the branches, staring directly at me. They looked just as curious about me as I was about them, their heads cocked in every direction. I could almost hear them asking, "What are yaw looking at, lady?" I snapped a few photos (left side, bottom right).

About three years later, I rediscovered those pictures and decided, just for fun, to paint the roosters. This was definitely not my usual subject matter, but with complete abandon, I started working on the design and then splashing on color. I loved working with the patterns of the tangled branches, the feathers, and especially their comical expressions. Before long, I had completed a full-sheet watercolor of this ridiculous chicken scene. I couldn't stop there. I later painted two half-sheet versions—which eventually sold—and two quarter-sheet variations, each with different poses and personalities. *What Are Yaw Looking At* now hangs proudly in my kitchen nook.



Another whimsical piece I created was *Ladies Night Out* (center right). During a summer trip to Mexico, I watched a troupe of beautiful young dancers performing with joyful abandon. I happened to have my small travel watercolor kit with me and quickly sketched the scene on a postcard-sized watercolor block (right side, bottom right).

Fifteen years later, I found that little sketch and decided, once again, to paint it "just for fun." Using mostly my 2-inch Robert Simmons brush, I transformed the tiny postcard into a full-sheet painting. Everything was finished except the faces. For weeks, I left them blank because I had no idea what expressions to use. One day, while looking in my vanity mirror, I began making exaggerated facial expressions, photographed myself, and transferred those expressions into the dancers' faces. ¡Muy bonito!



I had such fun painting these ladies that, when an opportunity came to display work in a co-op gallery, I submitted *Ladies Night Out* (center right) on a whim. To my surprise and delight, the original sold. I had a giclée made for myself and eventually sold two additional giclées. Now *Ladies Night Out* shares my kitchen nook wall with *What Are Yaw Looking At*. Every time I pass them, they still make me smile. Who would have thought that two playful experiments could bring so much joy?

CWA Student Art Awards at the Alameda County Fair



As part of its mission to promote creativity in watercolor, CWA sponsors \$50 awards for student artwork at the Alameda County Fair. This year, the fair introduced a new structure, organizing entries into two grade groups (6–8 and 9–12) and presenting both physical exhibitions at the Fair and virtual exhibitions online. Awards were presented in each category for both exhibition formats. The fair runs June 19–July 12, 2026,

9th–12th Grade Category

Physical Winner

Molly Lotz — *The Question Tree*

Title and image work seamlessly together. The tree’s question-mark form clearly communicates the concept while maintaining balance and structure. Movement flows in multiple directions, yet the composition remains grounded. Red splatters suggest blossoms, and a patterned gray vignette introduces atmosphere. Expressive and inventive.



Virtual Winner

Jasmine Moniz — *The Old Junk Yard*

A piece with a distinct surrealist sensibility. Ambiguous, curled forms on the tabletop invite curiosity while remaining visually convincing. The clock and lamp are well constructed, with confident use of color and shading. Subtle control of mid-value transitions demonstrates a strong understanding of watercolor handling. Engaging and skillfully rendered.



6th–8th Grade Category

Physical Winner

Dennis Pan — *The Small Boat*

This is a confident and well-executed painting. Working with a limited palette, Dennis keeps the focus clearly on the boat and its reflection. Simplified background trees and suggestive lily pad strokes support the composition without distraction. The result is cohesive, controlled, and visually satisfying.



Virtual Winner

Yuraje Davis — *Tree of Life*

A concept-driven work that successfully holds together despite its divided structure. The tree’s span, paired with a day-and-night theme, unifies the composition. A thoughtful balance of cool and warm colors reinforces this unity, while textured foliage and varied star sizes add richness and depth—a strong integration of ideas and execution.

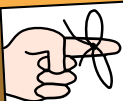

Materials Used

- 140 lb. Arches cold-press paper
- M. Graham honey-based watercolors
- Silver Black Velvet round brushes, sizes 8 and 10
- 1.5-inch flat brush
- Mimik size 8 reservoir liner
- Magello palette with a removable tray

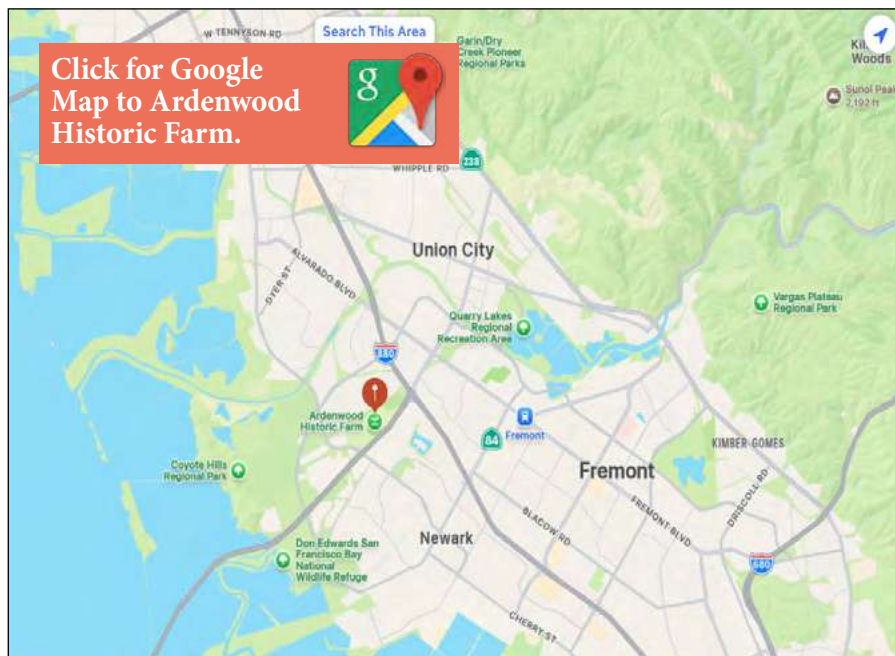

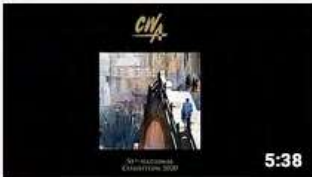

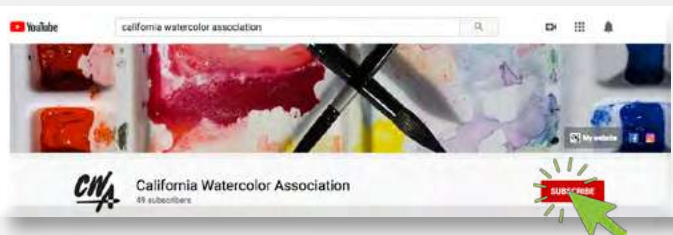
