


Lake Chabot Marina at Lake Chabot Regional Park 17930 Lake Chabot Rd., Castro Valley, CA October 18, 2014



Lake Chabot is a 5,069-acre park named after philanthropist Anthony Chabot, who created the lake by building an earth-fill dam in 1874–75 to act as the primary water source for the East Bay. The lake now acts as a standby emergency water supply. This photo was taken from the East Shore trail, about a half mile from the parking lot.



Location and entrance to Lake Chabot Marina. CWA will meet in the parking lot or near to it (picnic area) at 10 am (optional) to start the day, then again at 1:30 pm in the same area to share our paintings. Note that there is a \$5 parking fee.

The marina includes a boat launch, café, and bait shop. “Life at the lake” scenes can be painted close to the parking lot. For those who want more of a lake view, two trails branch off from the marina on the east and on the west. Bring your bike to venture farther into the park for more remote views.
